I. Old Business:

- 1) Because of some problems that are ongoing within the chapter, the Department Commander and the Department Adjutant recommend that we make the following changes to our bylaws:

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE IV – ADMINISTRATION

Section 2: The Chapter Executive Committee (See articles 3: page 2 these bylaws) shall be composed: The Commander, Senior Vice Commander, 1st Junior Vice Commander, Treasurer, ~~Immediate Past Chapter Commander~~ Judge Advocate and three (3) other elected Committee members from two-thirds (2/3) of members present. Adjutant for record keeping only, in case of a tie Executive Chairman will vote only to break tie.

Section 3: At the time specified in the Chapter Bylaws, (See article 4 – Officers these bylaws) the chapter may shall elect annually a Commander, Senior Vice Commander, 1st Junior Vice Commander, ~~and a treasurer~~. The Commander, with the approval of the Chapter, as may be necessary to operate the Chapter may appoint such other officers. Neither the Chapter Commander nor any Chapter Vice Commanders may serve as Chapter Adjutant or Treasurer.

BYLAWS

ARTICLE 3 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (CONT.)

Section 2: The executive committee shall be composed of eight members (8). Commander, Senior Vice Commander Junior Vice Commander, the Treasurer, ~~immediate Past Commander~~ Judge Advocate, Adjutant (for record keeping only) and three (3) chapter Executive Committee members, the latter to be elected from Chapter members in good standing, as above provided, and in accordance with “Nominations and Election” and three such committee members shall be elected thereafter at each annual Chapter election. The committee shall elect its own chairman from the membership, who shall not be the commander. None of the three (3) Chapter Ex-

Executive Committee members shall hold other elective office in this Chapter. The Chairman only votes to break a tie. (This chairman will always assure Chapter Commander is aware of all Executive Committee activity and actions should the commander not be present at a meeting).

ARTICLE 4 – OFFICERS

Section 1: The chapter shall elect annually a Commander, Senior Vice Commander, and Junior Vice Commanders as needed. **and a Treasurer.** Neither the Chapter Commander nor any vice commander may serve as Chapter Adjutant or Treasurer.

ARTICLE 6 – TENURE OF OFFICE

Section 1: Officers for the Chapter shall be nominated during the **December January** meeting and again immediately prior to the **January February** election meeting (Weather permitting).

Section 2: Elected and appointed officers shall be installed at **February March** meeting, within thirty (30) days of their election or appointment. They shall serve for one (1) year or until newly elected or appointed officers have been installed (weather Permitting).

ARTICLE 13 – OFFICERS AND THEIR DUTIES

Section 1: The appointive officers of this chapter shall consist of the Adjutant, Historian, Service Officer, Judge Advocate, Sergeant-at-Arms, Officer of the Day, Chaplain, **and Treasurer.** They shall be appointed by the Commander with the approval of the Executive Committee. The Adjutant may hold office as Treasurer if so **appointed.**

Having been read three times, we will entertain a motion from the floor to accept the proposed changes to the Constitution and Bylaws, AND SUBMIT THEM TO THE Department for approval. Motion made by Robert Saddoris, 2nd by Andy Staudt. Carried.

J. New Business:

1. Robert Saddoris and Tom Annonson are planning to attend the National convention in Orlando Florida. The dates are: 08/03/2019 - 08/06/2019.
2. Scotty Allison brought it to everyone's attention that outgoing Treasurer Jeri Harvey had worked much harder during her tenure as treasurer than anyone knew.

K. Executive Committee Action Items:

1. Commander would like to change our general meeting time from 1900 to 1800. This will be taken to the general membership at the next regular chapter meeting.

Motion was made by Scotty Allison to change the meeting hours, effective immediately. 2nd by Billy Wood. Carried. THIS MEANS THAT THE NEXT REGULAR

MEETING (APRIL) WILL BEGIN AT 1800.

2. Several members have asked that we get remote garage door openers for the building. Bruce Holden is tasked with gathering information.

This is primarily an info item, with the caveat that we have found an older remote that functions, and has been placed in the truck.

3. The new chapter starting in Roseau needs at least \$1000.00 to help get set up. Motion was made by Jeri Harvey, 2nd by Steve Hauschildt. Carried. This will be taken to the general membership at the next general meeting.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

A long time ago, on a peninsula far-far away, in the "land of morning calm," performing armed defensive security duties as a military policeman, in the early morning at the end of the midnight shift, it was bitterly cold, freezing and I was waiting. Waiting for what you might ask? Waiting for my shift to end? Waiting for this tour of duty (foreign assignment) to end? Waiting for a potential invasion from the North Koreans with supplemental orders to follow, or for Jesus Christ to return? The answer is, waiting for all four, but there was one thing all of us who were there did not have to wait for, the arrival of the Russian winter weather from Siberia. You may ask the question, what happened to the continuing article about Justice, Mercy and Grace? Last month as mentioned we were going to look at the return of Christ and what is meant by outer darkness. Well, in answer to your question - here it is because here we go.

We will do this as a continuation of the discussion in last month's article (March 2019) when we were discussing Jesus's answer about His authority to the Pharisees and High Priests (Matthew 21:23-46). As mentioned last month, Jesus not only answered their specific question (Matthew 21:27) but continued to expand the issue and bring it full circle in His conversation back to them (Matthew 21:28-46). It is very important to look at and understand the Pharisees and High Priests response (Mathew 21:45-46), because in this article on Justice, Mercy and Grace, we will look at the way Jesus continues to connect with the same Pharisees and High Priests as part of the same conversation, but using a different parable (Mathew 22:1). There have been volumes of books written about this parable (Matthew 22:2-15) with the response of the same Pharisees and High Priests in Mathew 21. We want to understand the parable's meaning in the context of the people Jesus is talking with (Pharisees and High Priests), the rules for bible interpretation and to ensure our view (the way we look at the parable) is consistent with the rest of the scriptures (Old and New Testaments) in terms of God's purpose - creation and salvation.

The parable has to do with the way people (everyone) responds to God (Romans 1:17-32), and Jesus Christ (John 3:16-20) through the Holy Spirit (John 14:16), which includes the plan God has in gathering into the air to meet Christ (I Thessalonians 4:16-17), all those (good and bad - Matthew 22:10) who positively respond to Him. Notice the Thessalonians, who came to know Christ (about AD 50), may have thought this already took place (II Thessalonians 2:3) about 17 years ago (about AD 33) at Jesus' crucifixion (Matthew 27:52-53) during the earthquake (Matthew 27:51), which caused the Roman Soldiers who crucified Christ to realize Jesus was the Son of God (Matthew 27:54). Yet, Paul in his letters to the Thessalonians shows the resurrection of the dead people at Jesus' crucifixion (who went into Jerusalem showing themselves to many people) was not the gathering of God's people to meet Christ later in the air. Paul shows the Thessalonians the rapture (gathering of God's people in the air to meet Christ) is a future event. A picture of this is consistent with the Old Testament regarding Elijah (II Kings 2:11). Jesus' mention of the person being put out into outer darkness (Matthew 22:13-14) has been understood by some scholars as hell, or by others as going into the great tribulation. Yet another view has to do with Jesus' audience. The Pharisees and High Priests, who may see the person in the parable as themselves (future generations) rejecting Jesus. Just like they would be the five foolish virgins as a picture of those not ready to wait a long time for Christ's return (Mathew 25). This rapture is God's ultimate Grace for those who wait patiently for Jesus.
