CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Wow, on Memorial Day, May 25, 2020, The State of Minnesota, The United States of America, and some countries around the world (France and others), woke up to a spark that ignited a fire in people from all walks of life. The center flash point is the manner one group of people treats the humanity of another group of people. An incredibly sad situation, lessons learned from generations ago, do not seem to be passed upon future generations. The application of these lessons never seems to take root in the lifestyle of many people. Memorial Day is a federal day of remembrance for those military personnel killed in the line of duty for our country. Now Memorial Day, 2020, will always have an additional meaning, the death of George Floyd for the humanity of all those who are mistreated, live in fear, and unlawfully killed. This includes our veterans here at home. This same inhumanity of one group of people towards another, regardless of purpose or attitudes, is the reason God gave His law and instructions in the scriptures to protect victims. Unfortunately, some people in authority misuse and abuse these laws according to their incorrect views. There seems to be a big gap between God's good intensions / instructions and mankind's misunderstanding and misapplication. Let us see what some of these issues look like:

Protecting the individual. Understanding the meaning and proper application of God's instructions through study and discernment helps to keep us from missing God's intensions. This further helps us avoid evil becoming an acceptable part of our lifestyle. One specific example is Jesus' temptation by Satan in the wilderness. Satan misused scripture out of context (Luke 4:9-12), used hunger against Jesus' identity (Luke 4:3-4), and the promise of ill - achieved authority (Luke 4:5-8), against Jesus. As a result, Jesus used The Book of Deuteronomy as a means of protecting Himself. Make no mistake about it, Jesus understood the seriousness of the moment while He was experiencing Satan's temptation. There are a lot of things we just do not do under times of stress that can make things worse, and Jesus example is for all of us because choices have consequences period. These consequences are not just for the individual, but for people and nations around us. The police officer's choice during those moments on duty, literally resulted in consequences around the world, whether he realized it or not.

Protecting the nation. When God said He chose Israel to be a holy nation, and a peculiar people, He was intending to use His relationship with Israel as a means of other nations (and people) getting to know God. Relationships are the way God uses us to reach out to other people. There are many illustrations of this in the Old Testament, with many descriptions of this in the New Testament. Unfortunately, there are some people tempted into turning this wholesome relationship process of knowing God into nothing more than having a religious (Isaiah 1), or arrogant attitude (John 9, 11:47-57). Recognizing who we are in Christ helps us discern our attitudes as well as shining a light on our reasons for serving God and people through the Holy Spirit.

In closing we would like to offer a prayer of protection for all those who are hurting, veterans and family members regardless of their situation, or where they may live. We want our leaders to make good, but difficult decisions as so we may begin to heal and move forward in our relationship with God.
