J. Old Business:

- Chapter HQ Fencing. At a past meeting, we voted to spend up to 1000.00 on a fence. This has been used in the construction of a gate. Andy Staudt made the motion that we spend (up to) another 1000.00 to complete the project. Randy Hanevold seconded. Carried.
 - This has been accomplished. The fence is complete, with the exception of a small area, which will be finished on Tuesday the 20^{th.}
- Electric Stove Hookup. Some time ago, a stove was donated to the chapter. It needs to be hooked up if we are going to use it. After much discussion, Andy Staudt made the motion that we allocate up to \$750.00 to get this accomplished. Gene Schwantes seconded. Motion Carried.
 This has been completed. The stove is wired and working.
- 3. Meyer Signs is supposed to show up sometime next week to determine what is needed for a new sign, designating the Bldg. the "Dave Sterr Memorial Chapter Headquarters."

2. At this time (1850) the meeting was closed for a private session. It was reopened at 1910 to resume the conducting of new business.

- Scotty Allisson brought forward the following veteran in need cases:
 - a. A disabled veteran is in need of either a new furnace, or a new heat exchanger for his existing furnace. Scotty proposed that we pay up to \$1500.00 to help pay for this. Andy Staudt 2nd the motion. Carried.
 - b. The surviving spouse of a veteran needs wood for the winter. We have been doing this for a number of years. Bruce Tiegen moves that we pay up to \$700.00 for this, but that this will be the last time, as we have exceeding our "lifetime" limit on this request. Mike Gutz seconded the motion. Carried.
 - c. A disabled veteran is in need \$450.00 for fuel oil. Jeff Meyer made the motion that we pay for this. Randy Hanevold seconded. Carried.
 - d. A disabled veteran is in need of \$1,061.00 worth of car repairs. Andy made the motion that we pay up to this amount for the repairs. Jeff Meyer seconded. Motion carried.

e. A disabled veteran has an outstanding bill of \$1,906.00 for ambulance service. Scotty has attempted to get the VA to pay form this, but they refuse. Bruce Tiegen moved that we pay up to \$1,000.00 towards paying this pill. Mike Gutz seconded. Carried.

L. Executive Committee Action Items:

Info Item: At the last executive board meeting, Scotty Allison brought the case of a disabled veteran whose RV had been impounded. The executive committee decided to offer \$1000.00 to the impound yard to settle this debt.

- M. Good of the Order: Nothing brought forward.
- N. Motion to adjourn: Motion made by Ward Sutton, 2nd by Jeff Meyer. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 1930 hours.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

There have been many funerals over the past several years. At our age, we all know Disabled American Veterans (DAV) leaders, family, veterans, friends, as well as members of other veteran service organizations who have passed away. I want to offer our condolences, respect, honor, love, and dedication to all who know them. All of us are certainly not getting any younger. This article is about all those who have passed away and those loved ones who are still with us. Yes, this article is about death and life from a biblical perspective. This is difficult and involves all of us in so many ways, loss of loved ones, a change in direction and relationships of families, friends, and organizations. Keeping this in context of the following scriptures, at the risk of being misinterpreted in a variety of ways, it is our intent to share Christ's hope and future with all of you. This includes sharing the protection God provides us, to include the cost and the price God paid for saving us from the second death (Revelation 2:11).

There have been many cults and religions (past/present) that glorify and encourage death in many ways. God never encourages death, but only wants people to be good, trust in Christ and serve God wherever He has put us in life. God wants people to change from doing/thinking bad things to good things (Romans 12:1-3, renew our minds) through the Holy Spirit working in our lives. God absolutely has no pleasure in the death of any wicked person (Ezekiel 33:11), He always encourages life and even tells people to choose life (Deuteronomy 30:19), God does not want anyone to harm themselves (including veterans) or harm anyone else (rioters). God wants all people to be saved (1 Timothy 4:6) and know Christ, but the choice is ours. This is not universalism. It shows the need for rebirth (John 3:16-17) asking Christ in our hearts, forgiveness, and staying with Christ to the end (Mark 13:13). If a person rejects or dismisses a relationship with Christ, no matter how relatively good they are here on earth, will die, by not accepting Jesus as the only person who can forgive and impart God's measure of goodness to them.

God told Adam how to live forever, the consequences of not following His instructions and what would eventually happen. God gave Adam the freedom of choice and the ability to make the correct choice. We all know what happened, and because of one man, death spread to everyone. Yet God used our hopeless situation - death, to protect us, and allow Christ - one man, to save us (Romans 5). In the Old Testament, people looked to the future to be saved by Jesus coming to earth, while we look back in the past. When God visits Adam and Eve after they disobey Him, God immediately protects them from The Tree of Life. If Adam while in his disobedient / rebellious status, ate from The Tree of Life, then he would live forever in a fallen or rebellious state - not good. As a result of God's protection, Jesus will come in the future and redeem us from our fallen nature (Genesis 3:22, John 10:10-25). Saving us hurt God terribly, but He gave us life and a hope for the future. Just as Jesus dying on the cross looks for a future hope (Hebrews 12:1-2). God wants us to live life with a deep sense of contentment, no matter the harsh conditions we experience in the past, currently face, or our fears of the future (1 Timothy 6:6). This includes being save from the second death in the future (Revelation 2:11) - Jesus was talking to His people. When we pass away, we experience the first death, this is tragic and we grieve, but the second death is even worst and real in eternity. When we know Christ and He knows us (John 10:10-25), the first death is simply a transition we experience in going to God and living forever. This is why funerals are a wonderful time to share Jesus and celebrate life (Luke 23:41-43).
