

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER



Three months have passed (Sept - Nov) since the start of the Election process and now we are waiting for Congress to certify the election results for our President of The United States on December 14th.

Regardless of your position on the issue, and conditions in our country, these three months bring back scriptural memories (1 Kings 11-12 & 2 Chronicles 9:31; 10-11); when Israel as a United Kingdom became divided into two kingdoms. The northern ten tribes of the original United Kingdom of Israel broke away and became The Kingdom of Israel and the southern two tribes of the original United Kingdom of Israel became The Kingdom of Judah. The process of this division is the subject of this article.

First, a cautionary note about the bridging principle for biblical interpretation requiring the full meaning and context of the original text. This involves rules of interpretation and application for the comparison of past events to the future. There are many rules for biblical interpretation called hermeneutics to ensure people do not take the scriptures out of context and make it say something the original author never intended, yet people do this all the time. Biblical misinformation is tragic. One example is to compare Israel's divided monarchy with the United and Confederate States, there are similarities/patterns, but there are dissimilarities as well. An example is Israel and the United States both experience a succession, but for different reasons. Yet Israel's civil war was averted because the king of the south (Rehoboam, Solomon's son and heir to the throne) listened to God and decided not to attack the king of the north (Jeroboam, Solomon's administrator for slave labor) to force unification. Rehoboam's original plan of forced unification would be more like North Korea's intensions during their invasion of June 1950 (my history understanding). This leads us to the division process.

The original purpose of Israel's division has more to do with God's purpose at that time in history (931 BC) as well as Jesus' time (4 BC - 30 AD) and the promise God made to King David (1 Kings 11:1-13). Solomon's reputation for wisdom and following God early in his life is in stark contrast to his later years of worshiping other gods (such as Molech - the god who commands infanticide). This happened because of the influence of his many wives (1 Kings 11:4-6). As a result, his kingdom would be divided upon his death, when his son Rehoboam, became king. This was not all, Solomon also implemented a very harsh slave labor policy. God informed Rehoboam and Jeroboam through His prophets His intention to make them both kings, which is why Solomon wanted to kill Jeroboam who had to flee to Egypt.

All of these factors played a role into the division of the kingdom under Rehoboam. The actual split in the kingdom (2 Chronicles 10 & 1 King 11) occurred when Rehoboam chose to listen to his young inexperienced advisors instead of his older more experienced advisors (sound familiar?), while refusing to listen to Israel's general public too (sound familiar?). All the Levites and Priests in Israel left and went to Judah because Jeroboam's false prophets forced them out (2 Chronicles 10:13-17). As a result, this strengthened Rehoboam and the Kingdom of Judah, even though Rehoboam was an extremely strict and harsh king, but he listened and followed God's instruction, help build Judah's defenses and spiritual life. In later years there would be no good king in the divided kingdom of Judah. Yet, all of this was still under God's control and for God's purposes (2 Chronicles 10:15). We need to remember that, despite how the election results may turn out, God still has a purpose for our nation.


