CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Hi everyone, last month we were looking primarily at three issues, what we can expect now, in the future and where are we on the biblical timeline. We touched on each of these biblically real-life questions. There is another observation relating to the question, what can we expect now? This observation has to do with the subject of this article, false teachers, prophecies, and a different gospel. Jesus made it clear there would be false prophets and miracle workers (Matthew 7:21-23). Paul wrote about false teachers sharing a different gospel (Gal 1:6-9). Paul further cautioned believers to be careful about the way they live and maintaining the correct doctrine (1 Tim 4:16). Just a couple of comments regarding these scriptures and some practical applications.

First, regarding Jesus' statement, not every sign or miracle represents Jesus having a relationship with that person, nor does it reflect that person doing God's will. In many cases a person such as this, will be using Jesus' name to bolster his or her own authority. It seems he or she is simply attempting to validate their claim for whatever reasons the person may have, but it has certainly nothing to do with a genuine relationship with Christ. One example of this is a large gathering of people (convention - conference) attending "faith healing" and in the process, a minister "proclaims" healings are taking place, to the point it becomes a show. Yet, in reality, the healing is believed to be true only at the moment because of the heighten excitement, but there is actually no true healing. Many people continue with the same condition, sickness, injury, or disability for the rest of their lives only to be told they did not have enough faith. This is sad because instead of telling the truth, these "ministers" simply blame the person who was not healed, re-victimizing them. Unfortunately, we have seen this occur on television. Let there be no mistake, God is not mocked, and that so called "minister" will reap what he sows (Gal 6:7). Yes, we live in a fallen world, and there are no words to help the poor person who wanted to be healed, especially when they are hurting, but for "ministers" to take advantage of them in this manner is reprehensible. At the same time however, this does not take away the integrity of those who truly lay their hands on sick people, heal them in Jesus' name, and actually have a relationship with Christ such as Paul and the other disciples (Mark 16:15-20). There is no "show."

Another concern is the manner in which some ministers live, and their doctrine. Sometimes it is interesting to note the statement made by some of these people who contradict The Bible. This is not just some disagreements between minor issues, such as when the rapture (the gathering with Christ in the air) will take place; before, after, or during, the last years here on earth - the tribulation. There is one false doctrine, "The Law of Sowing and Reaping.", This doctrine has to do with giving money, that is, the more seed (money) you sow, the greater is your harvest (financial stability). This is a misrepresentation. The real seed is not money, but God's word - specifically the work Jesus did for us on the cross. The harvest is not financial stability; it is other people growing in Christ. Yet, this does not take away from giving money to legitimate ministries to help spread the good news about our true condition in light of God's view. Our heart's current condition is really not good, and because of this we accept Jesus' work dying on the cross as God's punishment for us. Something only Christ could do. By acknowledging our sin and turning away from it, while accepting God's forgiveness, we can trust God to live eternally in a close relationship with Him. We hope God's word encourages and helps you.
