CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

A few months ago we were discussing communication and how It is wonderful being baptized. This is a special occasion for it truly reflects a new life. Jesus Christ, The Son of God, our Jewish Messiah gave us all an example for baptism because He was baptized (Matthew 3, Luke 3) Himself. Jesus did not need to be baptized, but the reason for why he told John it was necessary was because Jesus wanted to interrelate with our humanity. Yet, for us baptism is a change of direction in our lives (repentance) from sin resulting in a closeness with God and a refreshing time in The Father's presence until Jesus comes back (Acts 3:18-22): ¹⁸ But this is how God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, saying that his Messiah would suffer. ¹⁹ Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord,²⁰ and that he may send the Messiah, who has been appointed for vou—even Jesus.²¹ Heaven must receive him until the time comes for God to restore everything, as he promised long ago through his holy prophets. ²² For Moses said, 'The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own people; you must listen to everything he tells you (Deut 18:15)'. (NIV)

Peter's directions were given at this time in the scriptures when he was addressing the people of Israel who had crucified Jesus (Acts 2:36-41), but his instructions has ramifications for all future generations too. ³⁶ "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah." ³⁷ When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" ³⁸ Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹ The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call." ⁴⁰ With many other words he warned them; and he pleaded with them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." ⁴¹ Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day. (NIV)

A beautiful example of explaining Jesus in the Old Testament, baptism and the incredible sense of gratitude, joy and peace from God; is seen when Philip baptized the Ethiopian (Acts 8:26-40): ²⁶ Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Go south to the road—the desert road—that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." ²⁷ So he started out, and on his way he met an Ethiopian[a] eunuch, an important official in charge of all the treasury of the Kandake (which means "queen of the Ethiopians"). This man had gone to Jerusalem to worship, ²⁸ and on his way home was sitting in his chariot reading the Book of Isaiah the prophet. ²⁹ The Spirit told Philip, "Go to that chariot and stay near it." ³⁰ Then Philip ran up to the chariot and heard the man reading Isaiah the prophet. "Do you understand what you are reading?" Philip asked. ³¹"How can I," he said, "unless someone explains it to me?" So he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. ³² This is the passage of Scripture the eunuch was reading: "He was led like a sheep to the slaughter, and as a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

³³ In his humiliation he was deprived of justice. Who can speak of his descendants?

For his life was taken from the earth." May the God of peace, the joy of your salvation, the comfort of the Holy Spirit and Jesus' sacrifice always be an encouragement to you.

On Wednesday **October 5, 2016** from 10:00 am – 4 PM at the US Bank Stadium (Vikings Field) 1010 S 7th St. Minneapolis there will be an open house and autograph signing by the current surviving Medal of Honor winners. This is a rare chance to meet all of the surviving Medal of Honor winners at one time. Of the 76 living recipients, 6 earned their Medals of Honor in World War II, 6 in the Korean War, 53 in the Vietnam War, and 11in the War in Afghanistan. **3** earned their medal while serving in the U.S. Air Force, 50 in the U.S. Army, 15 in the U.S. Marine Corps, and 8 in the U.S. Navy.


