- 4. All decisions regarding mileage paid for deliveries have been rescinded, due to IRS restrictions. These will be discussed by the executive board, and a recommendation brought forward, before the next fiscal year.

ADJUTANT CORNER

** The VA budget totals \$176.9 billion for fiscal 2017, almost twice the budget total when Obama took office in fiscal 2009 (\$93.7 billion) and almost four times the total when the war in Afghanistan began in fiscal 2001 (\$48.7 billion). Of the 2017 total, roughly \$77.4 billion is set aside for discretionary programs, and the rest for disability, medical and education benefits, along with other mandatory spending.

** The VA employed about 365,000 workers in fiscal 2016, up about 88,000 people from when President Barack Obama took office in 2009. Employee bonuses and discipline has been a constant fight for department leaders in recent years, with critics saying they do too little to root out lazy or incompetent bureaucrats. In fiscal 2015, about one-third of the VA employees were veterans.

** Roughly 9 million veterans were enrolled in VA health care at the end of fiscal 2016, about 42 percent of the nation's veteran's population. That number was 7.8 million in fiscal 2009, roughly 33 percent of the total U.S. veteran's population at the time. Part of the increase is due to troops returning from wars in Iraq and Afghanistan, but the department has also seen increases in the usage rate from older generations.

** About 58 million medical appointments were scheduled by VA in fiscal 2016, an increase of almost 6% in two years. Almost a third of those appointments were scheduled with doctors working outside the VA system, in private clinics.

** About 93 percent of veteran's medical appointments are being scheduled within 30 days, per department data from December 2016. That's down about 1% from fall 2014, when department officials began tracking patient wait times in the wake of nationwide scandals about delayed appointments and cover ups. The average wait time for mental health care appointments is 4.5 days, roughly the same as the wait over the previous two years. The wait for primary care is 5.7 days (down from 6.7 in fall 2014) and the wait for specialty care is 10.2 days (up from 7.5 days in fall 2014). 8,481 patients on VA lists have been waiting more than four months for appointment requests, a number that swelled to more than 10,000 in early 2016.

** More than 960,000 veterans received some type of education benefits through VA in fiscal 2016, up from around 265,000 in fiscal 2009. The biggest contributor to that jump was passage of the Post-9/11 GI Bill in 2010, which offered full four-year tuition at state universities and a housing stipend to troops who served at least three years after 2001.

** An average of 20 veterans a day committed suicide in fiscal 2014, the latest information available. Past research had pegged that number at 22, but those estimates were drawn from fewer states and contained problematic guesses. It's unclear whether recent mental health efforts by VA have driven down the suicide rate.

** Another 303,673 benefit cases that are pending in the department's appeals system, as of Dec. 31, 2016, That's up from about 181,000 cases at the end of 2009. The cases typically take three or more years to fully complete.

** More than 2.6 million VA home loans were awarded in fiscal 2016, up about 500,000 from eight years earlier.

** Federal researchers estimate that 39,472 veterans were homeless as of January 2016, that's down from about 75,600 veterans on the streets in 2009, when Obama announced plans to house every veteran in America by the end of 2015. So far, 33 communities and three states have been certified as "effectively" ending veteran's homelessness, meaning they have the resources to rapidly house all veterans in their community facing financial distress.

Our chapter is currently first in the State for Membership; Also, MN is first in the Nation. We still need many more memberships, so keep up the good work of recruiting.

I will be going to the cities to help work on Veterans bills February 25th – March 2nd and to Washington DC for same purpose.

The Convention will be in Duluth this year during the last week of April, please plan to attend. State wide we now have 23 DAV vans that go to Sioux Falls SD, Fargo ND, St Cloud and the Cities. It has been a real honor to serve you as Adjutant over the last many years, and to now serve you as your State Sr Vice. God, Bless you and your families!

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

With the 20th of January, having been the Presidential Inauguration, we might as well all acknowledge this has been a pretty rough election cycle. The striking issue made here is the realization God works through national and personal crises in our lives. The Books of Lamentations and Job are clear indications of God's desire to work with us in these ways, while at the same time recognizing that life here on earth is not at all perfect, as reflected in the Book of Ecclesiastics. Yes, the scriptural political events that were so much a part of Israel's history reflect the numerous interactions God had with His people and the nations that surrounded Israel.

All the prophetic books were written at a time of great upheaval and during the times of tremendous political change, especially with world empires such as Egypt, Babylon and Persia. The point of all this? Simple, God is still in control even when things are in total chaos. Knowing that God is with us does not necessarily mean things will go smoothly, but even during the rough times, God never leaves us nor forgets about us (Hebrews 11).

Individually this may mean that God is redirecting our lives down a different path other than the one we expected to follow at the time. The important thing to remember is never compromise our values regardless of the cost. Yes, there has always been a cost to following Jesus. Yet in the end, that uncompromising cost has, and always will be, the best thing for us (Luke 14:25-35). When this occurs, then this is definitely not something to do (James 4:13-17). Even with the cost of following Christ there seems to be a deep peace that comes in doing whatever the Holy Spirit has a person do (Galatians 5:22-26). It may not make sense, but it does not and will not compromise our relationship with Jesus, or contradict the scriptures. One situation for example is "Taking the Lords Name in Vain..." (Deuteronomy 5:11). The meaning for this scripture is simply to not misuse God's name for anything we say or do. Most people think this only applies to swearing or using foul language, it actually means much more. An example would be getting entangled into relationships (dating, making friends, gang involvement, or establishing businesses) with people who use God's name for the express purpose of harming others, or taking advantage of them, to include criminal type behavior (Proverbs 1).
