

#### J. Old Business

- 1. The issue of members using the building/property was discussed. It was proposed that we allow any active member to use the facility, if nothing else is scheduled at the same time. No alcohol to be consumed on the premises, and the member sponsoring is responsible for cleanup. There is no fee for rental, but donations are happily accepted. Motion was made by Robert Saddoris, 2nd by Mike Gutz. Further discussion ensued. Vote was not unanimous, but motion carried.
- 2. A financial report for the Ride for the Troops was provided covering the last 2 years. After studying the report, it was proposed that we release the \$750.00 which had previously been designated for the event, but frozen until a financial accounting had been submitted). Motion by Steve Siats, 2nd by Glen Aagard. Motion carried.

#### K. New Business

- 1. Commander Sterr proposed enclosing the pole barn on the west side of the property. This will bring all of our operation to our chapter headquarters. Home Depot will consider donating time and materials. It does not include a poured concrete foundation so, it will be our responsible to provide the funding and work for that. Lakes Concrete will provide the concrete at \$75.00 per yard. Our cost will be about \$2,250.00. Home Depot Foundation will pay approximately \$12,700.00. It was proposed that we allow Commander Sterr to present the requests to the Home Depot Foundation, if approved, then the project will move forward, if not, it dies. Motion by Andy Staudt, 2nd by Steve Hauschill. Motion Carried.
- 2. The budget committee has been appointed by Commander Sterr. It consists of the following individuals: Tom Annonson, Bruce Tiegen, and Robert Saddoris. It will meet on Monday, 8 May at 1000 hours at chapter HQ.
- **3.** There is a spouse of a deceased veteran in need of a handrail on her outside steps. Walter James will check into this situation.
- **4.** Discussed the possibility of setting up a clothing donation trailer at the Beltrami County and Clearwater County Fairs. Issue tabled for the time being.
- Mike Gutz would like to offer NRA firearm Safety, Concealed Carry, First Aid, and Scuba Diving courses in our facility. Tabled and handed over to executive committee for further discussion.

#### STATE SENIOR VICE COMMANDER

We applaud Senators Patty Murray, Susan Collins, and Representative Jim Langevin for introducing the "Military and Veteran Caregiver Services Improvement Act" on March 9, 2017. https://d3dkdvqff0zqx.cloudfront.net/groups/dav/images/dav\_dava\_bigger.png

DAV has worked diligently for several years as a part of a larger coalition of veteran's organizations that promoted the advent of family caregiver support services for severely injured and ill veterans. Congress finally responded by enacting Public Law 111-163, the Caregivers and Veterans Omnibus Health Services Act of 2010. However, that law limited services and supports to family caregivers of veterans who were injured or became severely ill in military service only on or after September 11, 2001. That omission left thousands of veterans' families without the level of caregiver support and services they have needed because those veterans' health challenges, many from war injuries, occurred before that effective date.

If enacted, the Military and Veteran Caregiver Services Improvement Act would responsibly and finally address these families' needs on the same basis as those of veterans injured after September 11, 2001. Ultimately, when fully implemented, the bill would improve the lives of tens of thousands of veteran families, and will save the federal government a significant amount of resources that otherwise would need to be spent to provide institutional solutions to these veterans' health challenges and health maintenance. This bill is both beneficial to these families and a taxpayer-friendly measure.

Please write your elected representatives to urge co-sponsorship and support of passage of S. 591 and H.R. 1472. A letter has been prepared for this purpose or you may write your own to express your views. As always, thank you for your support. Click the link below to log in and send your message:

#### **CHAPLAIN'S CORNER**

Greeting, my first month as chaplain has gone by quickly. I have greatly enjoyed getting to know more of you. I love the diversity of this group of people. Each of my comrades is special in your own way. Some of you are bold about your faith and I love it. Acts 4:31 says "And when they had prayed, the place was shaken where they were assembled together; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they spoke the word of God with boldness." Others prefer to quietly live your faith and serve as an example. 1 Thessalonians 4:11 says "And that ye study to be quiet, and to do your own business, and to work with your own hands, as we commanded you." Both are equally valuable to this great organization.

Most of us fall somewhere in the middle. I once heard an analogy that God is like a diamond with many facets. Each of us has part of Gods character but none of us have all of God. Our earthly bodies and souls will only be made perfect when we meet our Lord and Savior at the end of life (1 Corinthians 15:34-45). Of course, some of us might still be living when Jesus returns and will receive our glorified bodies at that time, but that discussion is for another time. I cannot prove the diamond theory biblically but I do see that our God is bigger than we can ever imagine. Isaiah 55:9 says "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts higher than your thoughts." So, if it works for you great. If not, I would love to hear your perspective. The overlying idea is that each of us is created as special and precious to our loving Father.

When Bruce Holden first told me about this group, he talked about how working together and swapping stories is very healing. So far this is my favorite part of the job. It is great to be part of a group that is busy about the Lord's work. Another part of my job involves attending funerals and hospital visits. In preparation for this great privilege, I have been studying the process of grieving. Again, we are all different, and beautiful in our own way. Grieving is a process that looks and feels different on each individual. There is no right or wrong way to grieve. No one is untouched by death. It is a part of life. When a loved one passes on, the first stage is generally though not always denial. A coping mechanism kicks in that gets us through the days of planning the funeral and maybe taking care of the effects. We might feel a bit numb as we go through the motions of everyday life. I won't even put a time frame on this feeling. Feelings come and go and there is no order necessary. You might find yourself saying, "I cannot believe he/she is gone." You might pick up the phone to call the person only to realize they won't answer. Many of us feel God strengthening us through the first days, weeks and months. Others might wonder if they will see their loved one again. This is a very difficult question to wrestle with. I will cover it next month as we work through the stages of grief. For now, I leave you with the great words of the Apostle Paul. He's expressing that you shall not be alone. 2 Corinthians 2:4 " For I wrote you out of great distress and anguish of heart and with many tears, not to grieve you but to let you know the depth of my love for you." As a group, we can be like Paul and come alongside of our hurting friends. I continue to pray God's blessing over our DAV membership.




