

It looks like the summer months will be extra busy at the DAV building and property. We are in the middle of getting the pole barn on the west side of the lot enclosed for use as cold storage. It will be divided into two sections. The south section will be used to store the donated medical equipment. The north section is multipurpose. It will be used to store building equipment, storage of clothing program overage and a place to park one of the trucks when needed.

Things continue to go well with the clothing program and we continue to adapt to the continual changes with the process. Instead of traveling to Fargo and Duluth with trailer loads of product, we are now packing the goods into a semitrailer provided by the Savers folks. When it is full, we call for a driver to bring an empty replacement semitrailer. Josh Vrtacnik, Director of Operations/Deputy Adjutant from the State DAV office and the Saver's District Manager worked this out for us and it is saving us time, wear and tear on our vehicles and will be less costly in the long run. They are keenly aware of what Chapter 7 has done to stand as an example of a well-run program, and this is their way of helping us and other chapters to maintain solidly run clothing programs.

Our "Forget-Me-Not" and Clothing Programs continue to provide a steady stream of income for our "Veterans in Need" fund. I just want to take a few sentences here to again thank everyone for your volunteer hours. You are the workers behind the scenes who are keeping us strong and viable. Thank you also for your help and supportive words through our move to the 15th street location. We are inching away at improving the building and grounds, and the building is becoming a multipurpose facility for our DAV related activities.

I am proud of Chapter 7, proud of my comrades and proud of all the volunteers who support our organization. Be safe this 4th of July and enjoy what Bemidji has to offer in fun activities for the celebration!!

BUDGET PROPOSES TO REDUCE VETERANS' BENEFITS

On May 23, 2017, the President released the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) budget for fiscal year 2018. Contained within this budget were two legislative proposals that DAV strongly opposes because if enacted into law, they would seriously reduce benefits for our nation's ill and injured veterans, their families and survivors.1. The budget proposal contains a provision that would round down cost-of-living adjustments (COLAs) for disability compensation, Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC) and some other benefits for the next 10 years. The budget proposal also contains a provision that would scale back VA's



Individual Employability (IU) program for thousands of veterans. DAV strongly opposes this ill-conceived proposal. We are calling on all DAV and members and supporters to contact their members of Congress and urge them to reject these harmful proposals that would negatively impact injured and ill veterans, their families and survivors.
