

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Special thanks to Mike and Julie Gutz for writing for me last month. As we continue in the grieving process I would like to engage in the bargaining aspect. As human beings we cannot heal ourselves and thus we must look to God to find peace with the uncontrollable events of our lives. Some things are under our control. We can enjoy the fruits of the Spirit which include love, joy, peace, patience, kindness. goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control (Galations 5:22-23). Notice that these qualities become part of the individual Christian's character. This is not a promise as to how others might treat us. We cannot force others to be kind, gentle ect.... Each of us must seek God for ourselves and find Him in the mist of the storms of life. Jesus taught us to love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us.

This is all just words until the rubber hits the road. How do we get along with that difficult family member? It seems like they are always picking on us. Then we start to pray for them. Maybe we try to share our testimony. Does this make it better? Many times it seems like it gets worse. They feel judged and they react badly. Then we ask God why? The enemy in your midst is not aware that the light of Christ will hurt their eyes. Their reaction is one of pain and anger. The more you pray and share Scripture more they heap abuse on you. God says love your enemies? How do we do that? Do we just let them abuse us? Is this what Christ died for? God we ask why is this happening?

I remember crying out to God about these issues when my adult children were little. We were walking through the woods in springtime and we came to a small creek. My 5 year old son came up behind his little sister. She was trying to decide how to cross. He just pushed her right into the cold water. I heard myself cry out, "Nobody pushed you into the water." And the light of Christ hit my heart. I can't push anyone toward Christ. Jesus is the lover of my soul. He wooed me into His kingdom through loving kindness that was secretly between Him and me. I cried out to my God and he heard me. We met in my prayer closet and He ministered to me in all of my sin and unbelief. I fell upon the Rock which is Christ. No one pushed me. I let go and let God take control of my life.

In this broken condition we hopefully begin to seek that which we so desperately need: intimacy with God. I can't fix this God can you? Nothing that we do can fix this relationship. No amount of bargaining can bring the person back. Of course if they died in Christ and have been completed in him they wouldn't want to come back. If you are unsure of their salvation then we must turn that over to God as well. God knows who fits in His kingdom. We can only be sure of our own salvation. Studying the Bible cements the fact that Christ's death on the Cross was enough for me to be acceptable to God. I only insult God by trying to earn my place in heaven.

Death is the ultimate end of the relationship this side of heaven. All those unresolved issues seem like they will last forever. The pain is enormous and eventually we must seek healing from the only real source: the Holy Spirit. Death has been swallowed up in victory. Our final enemy was overtaken when Jesus rose from the dead on the third day. Where is your third day? How long will you preach in hell as Jesus did? When will you give up trying to fix others and find the Sabbath Rest in Christ alone? I pray that you see my heart here. I am preaching to myself. I am guilty of "pushing others into the water." This is my plea. Come join me in the River of Life. I am sorry for pushing. The water is refreshing and you will find rest for your soul. Let Jesus heal you and set you free. Then drink daily, find others that understand, love as God first loved you, and advance the kingdom of God by His love.
