CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Hello friends. I pray that you are able to enjoy the last few beautiful days in God's creation. There's nothing like that gentle breeze or the sun on your face to take away our troubles. Do Christians really have troubles? I don't know about you but I thought that if I gave my life to Jesus, then my troubles would be over. Didn't Jesus say, "Come all who are heavy laden, and I will give you rest (Matthew 11:28)." So does finding rest mean that you don't have any troubles? Lots of people turn to God in a moment of desperation. Our Lord delights in us when we turn to Him no matter what state of mind. He is faithful to meet us right in the middle of the mess of sin that we have made for ourselves. Sometimes we think ourselves the innocent victim of someone else's sin. That might be the case but really no one is completely innocent before God. Romans 3:23 says that "all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God."
