VA BURIAL, DEATH AND MEMORIAL BENEFITS:

The passing of a loved one presents many challenges to the surviving family. There are veteran-specific benefits afforded to eligible veterans, all of which must be applied for and certified by the surviving family. Notification of Death to the various VA and Department of Defense (DOD) departments will be made by calling any County Veterans Service Officer (CVSO). These will put Survivors Benefits correspondence to the surviving family into action, and the veteran's eligibility for each benefit can be reviewed. CVSO's work closely with the local funeral homes, Veterans Service Organizations and cemeteries to ensure the veteran's final wishes and the family's desires for tribute are fulfilled.

BY-LAW PROPOSAL

After discussions with the Department, it has been determined that we do not need to include the guidelines for reimbursement for out-of-state travel to National DAV functions in the By-Laws. They can stand on their own merit as a guide for approving or disapproving requests for reimbursement of travel expenses as it is laid out within them. Each request for reimbursement is to be reviewed by the Executive Committee for their recommendation of approval or disapproval.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

We had a wonderful state convention (Minnesota Department, Disabled American Veterans) last month (May 3-5, 2018). During the convention several of us (former, current, auxiliary, state auxiliary, members, state and chapter chaplains) had the opportunity to meet our National Chaplain, Mike Dover, which was really a privilege. Several of us had the opportunity to discuss a variety of issues with him. The issues involved salvation (knowing Christ), naturalism (materialistic-scientific worldview) and writing articles. You may have seen some of National Chaplain Dover's articles in the National DAV magazine. There were several common factors we shared in writing these articles; writing from experience, writing from a biblical and spiritual perspective through Bible studies, writing as a veteran, writing about our current culture and writing from the heart. Yet the purpose for writing is healing, a sense of relief we hope the individual reader reflects upon in the quietness of their heart. This may involve several kinds of situations from which we may need healing; interactions with poor military leadership and bureaucracy, combat, our experiences (medical, social, psychological, emotional and spiritual) here at home, etc.

Reflecting on these issues brings to mind Noah, most people think of Noah in terms of the flood he survives with his family, but there is another incident, a very disheartening event originating from his very own family (Genesis 9). Something we must protect ourselves from too - disingenuous. No doubt there may be other words for this. Yet this is something we seem to be seeing more each day, and perhaps there is something we can begin to do about it.

Upon reading Genesis 9, here are some interesting observations. Noah and his family are the only ones in the whole world. Most people read about Noah's compromising position (Genesis 9:21) saying all kinds of derogatory things. Yet, this is not the end of the story, as many people see. One thing has always been puzzling, after Ham tells his two brothers what happened to Noah (Genesis 9:22), Noah later curses Canaan (son of Ham - Genesis 9:25). Why did he curse Canaan and not Ham? Canaan had nothing to do with this! It is here we find the disingenuousness of Ham and Noah's very strong response against Ham in the form of making him feel the consequences of his actions through his children. Answering the above questions helps to understand not only the immediate situation, but the past, as well as helping to set the stage for events to occur in the future.

Ham telling his two brothers about their father is essentially telling the entire world something that is none of anyone's business, while talking behind Noah's back. The way to protect ourselves from situations like this is to keep in mind, "love [not enabling] covers all sins" (Proverbs 10:12). Why was Ham cursed? Well, according to God, Noah was a righteous person meaning, he had a personal relationship with God (Hebrews 11:7), therefore, Noah's response is a meaningful statement. Canaan, his grandson, being a part of Ham's family had already been showing the same tendencies as Ham, therefore Canaan was no little angel, and more than likely a full-grown man. Another consideration is the fact Ham's actions reflect his (Ham's) entire family. This is a prophetic situation because it certainly sets the stage for Abraham and Israel to deal with the Canaanites in the future (Genesis 24; Exodus 3 & 23). Notice the past too, God covered Adam and Eve (Genesis 3:21), while Ham did just the opposite for Noah, this is a definite pattern! If you have a need or want to talk, please call me.

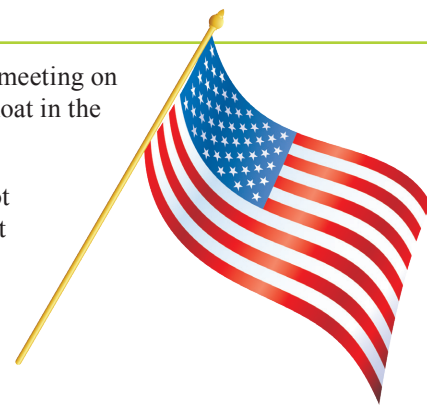


AUXILIARY CORNER
