

- H. Communications: There was 1 item received:

- I. Committee Reports:
 - 1. Membership Report: Three new members: Sue Horner; Mardy Karger, and William Waller
 - 2. Service Officer Report: 10 veterans were assisted in various
 - 3. Legislative Report: Joe Vene discussed the upcoming meeting of 21 June in St Cloud regarding the three recently bonded veteran's home sites.
 - **4. Hospital Chaplain Report:** 2 hospital visits were made.
 - 5. Entertainment: Discussed the 4th of July parade, and the Summer picnic. Our presence at the parade will include 3 vehicles and people walking to hand out Candy. The vehicles will be the Pick-up, a wrapped trailer, and the transportation van. Ward Sutton is working on getting the picnic organized.
 - **6. Fundraising committee:** Discussed the recent Ride for the Troops event. Disappointing outcome due to inclement weather. Discussed upcoming Wal-Mart Fundraiser (29-30 June). Volunteers are needed for both days. Discussed several other upcoming events, such as the Blueberry Festival, and the Woodcarving Festival.
 - 7. Newsletter Committee: Working on procuring new advertisers. Tom Annonson reports that he has raised \$825.00 toward the July Newsletter.
 - 8. Medical Equipment Report: Medical Equipment report: No report available.

J. Old Business

1. Commander Sterr discussed a case that was resolved at the last regular meeting that needs further action. An elderly veteran needed to move into town for medical reasons and needed \$2000.00 for expenses. Motion was made by Walter James.

and 2nd by Bruce Tiegen. It was carried. The problem is that the actual cost was \$3,058.00. Beltrami County VSO kicked in \$500.00, leaving a remainder due of \$558.75. Wendell Afield made the motion to pay the additional \$558.75. Randy Hanevold seconded the motion. Discussion ensued, and the question was called. Although the motion carried, it was not unanimous.

K. New Business

- 1. Commander Sterr reports that the VSO from Lake of the Woods County contacted him regarding the case of a wheelchair bound disabled veteran in need of assistance to make his home handicapped accessible. Specifically, the floor is in desperate need of repair. The repairs will be done gratis by local veterans. but the cost of materials is prohibitive. If we will pay \$2000.00. the Lake of the Woods County VSO will cover the remainder. Randy Hanevold made the motion that we pay \$2000.00 AND NO MORE. Paul Wiest 2nd. Carried.
- 2. A presentation was made by Paul Wiest about a proposed Columbarium in Greenwood Cemetery.
- 3. Bruce Holden presented the revised proposed budget for 2019. This was the second presentation. Jim Guildersleeve made the motion that we accept the revised budget. Paul Wiest 2nd the motion. Carried.
- 4. Wendell Afield discussed the food shelf budget shortages. He suggested that we donate to this cause. It was pointed out that this was beyond the scope of our mission to help disabled veterans, or veterans in general. If it could be shown that the donation went ONLY to veterans, then it might be possible. Wendell will look further into the issues, and then report back.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Today there are many different perceptions that come to mind about the prophets. Some are correct, and many others are not, such as being religious, mystics, fortune tellers, and so forth. Actually, the prophets were not religious at all (Isaiah 1), they were not mystics (Lev 19:31 - 20:6) and certainly not fortune tellers (I Corinthians 13:9-13).

The Prophets had a very close relationship with God and spoke to the people or government officials on behalf of God. The prophets spoke of God's intentions, plans, warnings, judgment, reconciliation, blessings and love. This includes instances when God had to correct and restore His people. Yet, God would never do something without letting His prophets know first, whose job it was to tell the people (Amos 3:1-8).

The prophets were very instrumental in the times of the Old Testament during the exile. The exile was a very tumultuous time for Israel because they were separated from the land God had promised them. Why would God want to do this? Why would He correct His own people in such a seemingly harsh manner? The prophets were sharing not only the reality of God's character, but the fact that He does not show favoritism. God is a Covenant God, in other words He stands behind the agreements He made with the forefathers of the Jewish People. This all goes back to God wanting to create a people for Himself, and the hope they can look forward too, even after being punished in later generations (Genesis 12). This is so very important because we have been made a part of this process through Christ. God has by no means abandoned His plans for Israel and for reaching out to everyone with the hope and freedom in Christ. Jesus has not returned yet, though He will (Acts 1, Matthew 24, Mark 13, Luke 21, Revelation 22) and His reward is with Him (Rev 22:12).

As we are waiting for Christ's return, some would say there are no more prophets. Yet, in The Book of Acts, prophets continued to function, though they have a different (confirming) role, because now we have the Holy Spirit who teaches, reveals and guides us in the things of God as we do our part in studying the scriptures. A person may consider this one fact, we are still living at a time consistent with God working out His intensions to reach out to humanity. This began in Genesis, continues through the warnings and hope of The Prophets, through the work of Jesus here on earth (now currently in heaven), the dynamics in Acts and the future events in Revelation.

Some people would ask, what about all the people who lived and did not know God through the witnessing of the Jews or Christians? Will they still go to heaven? It is important to understand the tremendous blessing we all have, to be a part of what God is doing, to reach out to others, it is very humbling. Yet, this will not prevent someone from knowing God and developing a relationship with Him. Why? Simple, because God can and does reveal Himself through other means (Romans 1, Acts 9, I Cor 15:9, Rev 1), just look at the time (Genesis 11:26-12:1) when God revealed Himself to Abram (later known as Abraham). This is all we know from the scriptures about Abraham, but what was it about Abraham in this first encounter with God? What was the essence or quality God found in Abraham to call him? Remember Abraham originally came from out of the Ancient Mesopotamian religious culture. Yet, Abraham chose to believe in God, Yahweh, (The Father) and rejoiced in Jesus day too (John 8:56). A wonderful blessing!
