CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

We have covered a variety of different subjects and considerations over the years. We have touched on relationships, biblical topics, current cultural and veteran issues. One issue that many people would rather disregard is the subject of hell. Now, before you decide to throw away this article, consider this. When a person is already hurting, or in the process of drowning, it is not appropriate to cause more harm by making things worse. Unfortunately, many people have approached the subject of hell in this manner, which is very sad - this is not helping anyone. Jesus Christ, on the other hand, did not come to earth to condemn anyone (John 3:17), but instead he came to warn us (Luke 16:19-31). Jesus Christ, The Messiah, God's Son, who is both fully man and fully God came to earth to save us from hell (John 3:17). God does not re-victimize people, as a matter of fact, God is not pleased with the death of any evil person (Ezekiel 33:11), in fact, wants everyone to turn to him and be saved (I Timothy 2:4).

There is a common question often heard, "How can a loving God send a person to hell?" The first part of this simple answer is, "He doesn't!" A person may then ask, what is all this stuff about hell anyways? Hell was made for the devil and his angels (Matthew 25:41), it was never made for mankind. Hell was not meant for people. Yet as a result of disobeying God in our lives (and we all have - thought, word and deed), a person will automatically end up in hell since spiritual death is its' consequence (Romans 6:23). Therefore, God continues to be so focused on saving people from Adam and Eve throughout history, to include us, as well as people in the future, through his Son, Jesus Christ. Many of the verses mentioned above always emphasize turning our lives over to God and having a direct relationship with Jesus Christ. So many people think that living a good life or obeying the law will get them into heaven. No where in the Bible does God ever mention that this is a way to get into heaven. It was by trusting, believing and obeying God (not any laws) that Abraham was considered to be in good standing with God (Romans 4:3). Believing and trusting in God came first, it was not until over 400 years later that the Ten Commandments were given. When a person believes and trusts in Christ, then they will automatically want to obey Him. Now that we have covered the first part of the simple answer. There is a second (last) part to this simple answer too.

Again, the question is, "How can a loving God send a person to hell? The second part of this simple answer is, "We do" (Matthew 12:37). This involves the kind of relationship we have in Christ (Matthew 12). What we believe, say and do in our lives here and now has eternal consequences. If we have a relationship with Christ we will go to heaven and be with Him. If we are trying to get to heaven by any other way, our own way (telling God the way things should work out), then being in hell will be the consequences of those decisions. We live in a very complicated world, yet God is wanting to keep things simple for our salvation. God is kind and wants a relationship with us (Matthew 10:24-33), yet obedience to Christ is necessary, comes from the heart and is shown through action. God wants to comfort those who are hurting, heal relationships, protect you from bad relationships (Proverbs 1), or get you out of relationships (Genesis 21). Jesus wants you to be available to Him along with the guidance and comfort of the Holy Spirit, this means to surrender your will (desires and aspirations), take risks and trust Him (Matthew 12).
