

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

When it comes to really difficult transitions we can face some hard uncertainties. This is true especially when the changes are getting worse and it seems hard to know where God is during our situations. When we are always told God is full of mercy, compassion and love, what do we do? We have a lot of hurting veterans.

As you may recall, the article last month touched on cultural and veteran issues that seem to shake us at our very core. Israel experienced a tragic shaking in their own history too - the exile. Historically the exile involved three sets of Jews; one set was sent to Babylon (modern day Iraq), another set was left in Judah and the other set traveled to Egypt. This was a very tumultuous time in Israel's history and a time when many of the prophets spoke on behalf of God to his people the Jews. It has been said, if the exile never occurred, then there would have been no need for the prophets or the prophetic books. It was before, during and after these tumultuous times God spoke to his people, all recorded in the Prophetic Books (Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther, Isaiah through Malachi).

Volumes of books, studies and essays have been written about this time. Sufficient to write here is the hope we have in these scriptures that God is real, keeps his word and holds people accountable. It was during these hard times God was with His people, and a time when the Jews got to know their God even more. This is good news for us too, because Israel's God is our God and this gives us hope, because it shows God really does want to help, restore and heal us, even if the process can be hard at times.

The reason why God exiled the Jews to Babylon was because the Jews broke their covenant or agreement they had with God through Moses (Exodus through Deuteronomy). Up until this time, God's presence had been with the Jews in the temple of Jerusalem. When it was time to hold the Jews accountable to the covenant, God simply withdrew his presence from the temple and thus began the process of the exile when another nation (Babylon) invaded Judah and deported them. As a side note, it is interesting God used the surrounding nations to invade Israel/Judah at this time, just as God used Israel in their past as a people (nation) in Egypt, to invade the promised land in order to hold the Amorites accountable for their actions (Genesis 15). Up until that time, it may be that God had waited over 400 years with the Amorites showing them mercy.

As a result, once God withdrew from the temple, the Jews believed God deserted and left them in a foreign land (Babylon). The Jews had absolutely no hope (The Book of Lamentations). At that time (585 BC), it would have been really good to hear from God. So God had Jeremiah write a letter with a message to the Jews in Babylon. God told them to pray for their city in Babylon, so things would go well for them. They could also expect the hope of returning back to Judah (Jeremiah 29). Needless to say, it is hard to imagine praying for a city in the very nation that just deported a person and their family. This probably did not go over so very well in their response (Psalm 137). About that same time, God sent Ezekiel with a message to the Jews in Babylon too. God said He was in His chariot (Ezekiel 1) and was not tied to the land back in Jerusalem. This meant a great deal of hope for them back at that time, because God actually moved with them to Babylon. In other words, His throne was no longer fixed in one place.

This has an application for us today because God is no longer in a Jerusalem temple, but is in the hearts of His people. God is just as much with us through Christ today that allows us to have the confidence to come to Him in prayer for any needs we may have.


