Proposed Change:

Section 2: The Chapter Executive Committee (See articles 3: page 2, these bylaws) shall be composed: The Commander, Senior Vice Commander,

1st Junior Vice Commander, Treasurer, Immediate Past Chapter Commander Judge Advocate and three (3) other elected Committee members from two-thirds (2/3) of members present. Adjutant for record keeping only, in case of a tie Executive Chairman will vote only to break tie.

Currently reads as follows:

Section 3: At the time specified in the Chapter Bylaws, (See article 4 – Officers, these bylaws) the chapter may elect annually a Commander, Senior Vice Commander, 1st Junior Vice Commander, and a treasurer. The Commander, with the approval of the Chapter, as may be necessary to operate the Chapter may appoint such other officers. Neither the Chapter Commander nor any Chapter Vice Commanders may serve as Chapter Adjutant or Treasurer.

Proposed Change:

Section 3: At the time specified in the Chapter Bylaws, (See article 4 – Officers, these bylaws) the chapter may shall elect annually a Commander, Senior Vice Commander, 1st Junior Vice Commander, and a treasurer. The Commander, with the approval of the Chapter, as may be necessary to operate the Chapter may appoint such other officers. Neither the Chapter Commander nor any Chapter Vice Commanders may serve as Chapter Adjutant or Treasurer.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 3 -- EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Currently reads as follows:

Section 2: The executive committee shall be composed of eight members (8). Commander, Senior Vice Commander Junior Vice Commander, the Treasurer, immediate Past Commander, Adjutant (for record keeping only) and three (3) chapter Executive Committee members, the latter to be elected from Chapter members in good standing, as above provided, and in accordance with "Nominations and Election" and three such committee members shall be elected thereafter at each annual Chapter election. The committee shall elect its own chairman from the membership, who shall not be the commander. None of the three (3) Chapter Executive Committee members shall hold other elective office in this Chapter. The Chairman only votes to break a tie. (This chairman will always assure Chapter Commander is aware of all Executive Committee activity and actions should the commander not be present at a meeting).

Proposed Change:

Section 2: The executive committee shall be composed of eight members (8). Commander, Senior Vice Commander Junior Vice Commander, the Treasurer, <u>immediate Past Commander Judge Advocate</u>, Adjutant (for record keeping only) and three (3) chapter Executive Committee members, the latter to be elected from Chapter members in good standing, as above provided, and in accordance with "Nominations and Election" and three such committee members shall be elected thereafter at each annual Chapter election. The committee shall elect its own chairman from the membership, who shall not be the commander. None of the three (3) Chapter Executive Committee members shall hold other elective office in this Chapter. The Chairman only votes to break a tie. (This chairman will always assure Chapter Commander is aware of all Executive Committee activity and actions should the commander not be present at a meeting).

ARTICLE 4 – OFFICERS

Currently reads as follows:

Section 1: The chapter shall elect annually a Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commanders as needed, and a Treasurer. Neither the Chapter Commander nor any vice commander may serve as Chapter Adjutant or Treasurer.

Proposed Change:

Section 1: The chapter shall elect annually a Commander, Senior Vice Commander, and Junior Vice Commanders as needed. and a Treasurer. Neither the Chapter Commander nor any vice commander may serve as Chapter Adjutant or Treasurer.

ARTICLE 6 – TENURE OF OFFICE

Currently reads as follows:

Section 1: Officers for the Chapter shall be nominated during the December meeting and again immediately prior to the January election meeting (Weather permitting).

Proposed Change:

Section 1: Officers for the Chapter shall be nominated during the December January meeting and again immediately prior to the January February election meeting (Weather permitting).

Currently reads as follows:

Section 2: Elected and appointed officers shall be installed at February meeting, within thirty (30) days of their election or appointment. They shall serve for one (1) year or until newly elected or appointed officers have been installed (weather Permitting).

Proposed Change:

Section 2: Elected and appointed officers shall be installed at February March meeting, within thirty (30) days of their election or appointment. They shall serve for one (1) year or until newly elected or appointed officers have been installed (weather Permitting).

ARTICLE 13 – OFFICERS AND THEIR DUTIES

Section 1: The appointive officers of this chapter shall consist of the Adjutant, Historian, Service Officer, Judge Advocate, Sergeantat-Arms, Officer of the Day, Chaplain. They shall be appointed by the Commander with the approval of the Executive Committee. The Adjutant may hold office as Treasurer if so elected.

Proposed Change:

Section 1: The appointive officers of this chapter shall consist of the Adjutant, Historian, Service Officer, Judge Advocate, Sergeantat-Arms, Officer of the Day, Chaplain, and Treasurer. They shall be appointed by the Commander with the approval of the Executive Committee. The Adjutant may hold office as Treasurer if so elected.

Because this issue has been approved by the general membership, it needs no further approval, and will be carried out forthwith.

She made a motion that we use part of it to raise our donation at the usual \$5000.00. Bruce Tiegen seconded. Carried. This will be carried to the general membership at the next general meeting. Motion was made by Steve Siats to use some of the anonymous donation to increase our donation from \$1000.00 to \$5,000.00. 2nd by Andy Staudt. Motion carried.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

The last three months we have been looking at issues involving justice, mercy and grace. This includes the interrelationship of all three and the impact these have on veterans. The overall context until now has been the interaction (conflict) between Jesus, Pharisees and a woman (John 7:53-8:11). As we have seen Jesus was being set up for a fall by the Pharisees who were using the woman. Yet Jesus, who was using understanding, wisdom and discernment was able to manage all three issues (justice, mercy, grace) while at the same time navigating the complex situations (demands, law, implied attitudes, victimization, and judgmental actions) involving the Pharisees and woman. This was done by kindness and patience through freedom, in other words, the liberating work God does on behalf of all humanity. While considering the article for this month, there is another example of the liberating work God has done on behalf of everyone in the middle of a crises, where a decision had to be made, and action taken (Genesis 3:21-24).

At this point Adam and Eve already had disregarded God's instructions (Adam's disobedience was deliberate, Eve was tricked) and God had already spoken to both of them as well as Satan (Genesis 3:9-19). This is when God made coats of skin and clothed them (Adam/ Eve). Some scholars view this in very significant terms, there is more to this than Adam and Eve just getting dressed because of being embarrassed. This is something God did for Adam and Eve, 'making the coats of skin', the connotation here has to do with God making the very first sacrifice for sin, in other words, sin is serious, and it cost the life of an innocent animal. Some would say this is unfair, why should an innocent animal pay the price for someone else messing up? Yet in the future, we see later in the scriptures, this would only cover up their disobedience, it would take more to resolve it once and for all. Again, it was God who had to do the sacrifice Himself, but this time it would be Jesus who would be the sacrifice. The question again becomes, why should God pay the price for us? The answer is because He loved us and took it upon Himself to do what nobody else could accomplish.

The other part of the phrase, 'and clothed them', according to some scholars has the connotation of being dressed in a priestly garment. In the future, and later on in the scriptures, we see the priesthood established through Aaron as being passed down through the High Priests whose job was to be a mediator and represent the people in front of God. Again, God ended up being our priest. Jesus became our High Priest. These examples of God taking the initiative on our behalf to provide a means for being able to come back to Him. Adam and Eve were both the sinners, yet in a remarkable way, God sees them as priests too. Justice, mercy and grace are all here, but there is one other thing that had to occur, once again, God needed to intervene on behalf of Adam and Eve.

As a result of their current fallen nature at the time, they could not eat from the Tree of Life (Genesis 3:22), had they done so, they would have forever lived in their current fallen state. God had to protect Adam and Eve from getting into more eternal trouble, a situation that would have been unrecoverable, if they had eaten from the Tree of Life after they disobeyed God. At this point, God's eternal plan of saving us from disobeying Him was put in motion, and would culminate through Jesus, God taking upon Himself the means to get us back to Him, this was alluded to by Genesis 3:15. God views us through His Son, Jesus Christ, who did not come to condemn us, but give us life (John 3:16-17).
