





CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

During the course of our lives, we all can think back at one time or another when we prayed to God. It may have been in a very intense battle as many of us recall being in war. It may have been a debilitating disability because of a training accident. It may have been a medical condition ending our military service. It may have also been through the death of a close relative or friend. Regardless of our experiences in and after military service praying and asking God for help with whatever it is we are having to go through is something The Bible encourages us to do (1 Peter 5:7). God loving humanity, even though we are all sinners, and once enemies of God (Romans 3:23 and Romans 5:10), gave to us Jesus Christ who is the only person who could reconcile us back to God by taking our sins upon Himself and being punished by God in order to satisfy God's Justice. Therefore, it is though Jesus that God's love and justice are both demonstrated side by side to all of humanity in (John 3:14-17)

- 14. Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up,
- 15. that everyone who believes in Him may have eternal life.
- 16. For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that everyone who believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.
- 17. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through Him....

This reminds me of the criminal who was crucified with Christ (Luke 23:40-43). This criminal first addressed his partner in crime on the other cross, then asked Jesus "Lord, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus' answer is priceless and filled with hope when He said "Today you will be with me in Paradise." Just think, what a wonderful blessing to be with Christ in His Kingdom! Notice this wonderful blessing has nothing to do with anything here on earth. It has everything to do with heaven and Jesus' future Kingdom here on earth.

There is another observation here to be made regarding the article last month. As you may recall, we were discussing the manner some ministers seem to focus on God blessing us here and now on earth with financial security and health. As a result, these ministers are misrepresenting God's good news for eternal life. Consider all the people who suffered terribly because they did not misrepresent or compromise their faith in Christ (Hebrews 11:35-40).
