- 3. <u>Hospital/Sickness & Distress</u>: Chaplain Mike reported that he had two hospital visits and he attended the funeral for Leo Talevson. Also attending the funeral were Glen Aagard and Darrel Baltzell.
- 4. Legislative: Nothing to report.
- 5. <u>Medical Equipment</u>: Commander Gene reported 12 issues and 22 donations.

 - 1. <u>Veteran in Need</u>: At the June 6 Executive Board Meeting, Scotty Allison brought forward a matter concerning a Veteran who passed away recently. The people in charge of the estate are not family members, as the Veteran had no family. The Veteran's Service office staff are in support of the additional request being brought forward at this meeting. The Chapter had already taken care of a month's rent but there is another request by those in charge of the estate for assistance with one more month's rent. A motion to pay another month's rent for the Veteran's apartment was made by Jeff Meyer and seconded by Bruce Tiegen. Motion carried. This case will be taken to the next general meeting for review and final decision.

After discussion where more specific information was provided, the membership agreed with the decision by the Board to pay a second month's rent for the Veteran's apartment. *Motion made by Randy H.; seconded by Ron K. Motion carried.*

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

We are back on track with our task, an in-depth consideration of biblical citizenship. This month we will be looking at the question; what does it mean to be a servant? A follow-up question may be: When does a person cross the line with an attitude of pride and cease being a servant? The answers to these questions can have profound impact on a person's life. A person may genuinely start out with a deep sense of passion to serve, but in the end, exchange their passion for glory, and lose sight of being a servant. Unfortunately, this all too often occurs as a biblical citizen, and we must always be careful to not let this happen.

As citizens of the United States of America, we are all servants. We provide security to our republic, the American People, and "defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies foreign and domestic" Our service in the military proves our commitment to be servants. Regardless of rank, prestige, or time of service, while setting aside the temptation for pride, we were all called to be obedient to our nation's cause. Yet, we continue to serve in so many different ways, such as serving other veterans with assistance, and serving our community with dignity and respect. Often, at times, we do not look at any desire for compensation, except for that which is necessary to complete the mission. Unfortunately for those who are looking for benefits or prestige beyond the call of being a servant, unfortunately have crossed the line, and given into the temptation of pride. This is all too common for anyone who is human and believe it or not, for angels too (Isaiah 14:12-16 and Ezekiel 28:12-19)! The end result of such pride is bad news. "Pride goes before destruction, And a haughty spirit before a fall" (Proverbs 16:18, Amplified Bible).

Unfortunately, this same prideful condition is common even among those who knew and were servants of Jesus (Mark 10:35-45). Our best defense of continuing to be a servant is to continually remind ourselves of Christ's humility and the commitment He had in doing The Father's will on our behalf (Romans 5:8). Jesus' humility was strength in being able to continue God's work going to the cross as shown by His prayer in Gethsemane (Luke 22:39-46).

Biblical citizenship has much to do with our attitudes, beliefs, and obedience as servants. Our culture often times seems to hijack and misappropriate the true meaning of our citizenship and the biblical meaning of humility. Today we have seen a lot of media attention given to the January 6th investigation. Observing military personnel, veterans, public servants (Law Enforcement / Fire Fighters) and other citizens commit criminal acts of violence was very disheartening. This notion of January 6, 2021, "Storming the Capitol for God and Country" was actually a criminal event. There were many good law-abiding citizens who attended the political rally at the White House on that same day, but departed the area, not wanting anything to do with any criminal events of violence.
