

Example, knee replacement surgery, need a walker, get it from DAV, no charge, before surgery rather than having to by one.

DAV's fiscal year ended on June 30, 2022, during the past year Chapter 7 distributed an overall amount of \$80,554.15 and of that \$34,954.85 went to individual Veterans. If you have any questions regarding these figures, please feel free to contact me.

- C INTRODUCTION OF GUESTS OR VISITORS: A welcome was extended to Mr. Bidal Duran who is running for Beltrami County Sheriff. Mr. Duran has been a police officer for 10 years and prior to that served in the Marine Corp. He outlined his educational history and shared his family information.
