Well, I hope everybody is able to stay warm and health through the coming winter season and I wish you all a Very Happy Thanksgiving.





CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Chaplain's Corner

Hello (English); Bonjour (French), Hola (Spanish), Zdravstvuyte (Russian), Anyoung Haseyo (Korean), Shalom (Hebrew), Konnichiwa (Japanese), God Dag (Norwegian, Swedish), Guten Tag (German); all you fun loving comrades.

This month we continue our discussion from last month, beginning with the comments made by our other Founding Fathers, regarding their comments about the necessity of good financial stewardship. Alexander Hamilton, our very first Secretary of The Treasury stated: "Nothing can more interest the national prosperity than extinguishing the present debt and to avoid as much as possible the incurring of any new debt. Establish that a government may decline a provision for its debts, though able to make it, and you overthrow all public morality, you unhinge all the principles that must preserve the limits of free constitutions, you have anarchy, despotism, or what you please, but you have no just or regular government."

George Washington, President at the time, agreed and stated: "The progressive accumulation of debt, ultimately endangers all governments."

President Thomas Jefferson further expressed his opinion on the same subject just as forcefully as President George Washington as well as Secretary of the Treasury Alexander Hamilton. Indeed, our Founding Fathers emphasized and re-emphasized the same biblical mandate from God to the nation of Israel (Deuteronomy 15:6) as mentioned in our article last month.

The whole entire issue of debt continues to be a burden for all of us even into the 21st century, regardless of the desensitization of our present congressionally elected officials, voters, and advisors to the executive branch. Debt continues to lead towards taxation, servitude, and oppression. God understands money, and recognizes the financial liabilities we have as individuals, a society, and governments. God not only cautions us about the wisdom for fiscal responsibility in the operation of our financial world here on earth, but always cautions us not to get confused between the use of money in this world, the attitude we have towards money, the oppressive nature the financial system can be, and the fact that money has absolutely no bearing on our salvation.

Unfortunately, there have been some ministries whose leaders have said if you will contribute financially more to "their ministry in the form of a seed" then the more you will financially receive "in the form of a harvest from God". Jesus refers to many of these issues throughout the New Testament. We will be exploring more of these financial issues later next month as we transition from the use of money by governments to the use of money by ministries, and make no mistake, just as there is a dark side of government using money, so there is a dark side to the way ministries can use money.

On the lighter side, we wish you a wonderful Thanksgiving, a time to connect with others and may you look forward to our heritage as citizens and the wonderful promises God has for the future (I Thessalonians 4:13-18)
