VETERANS DAY ON THE HILL 2023

December 20, 2022

Greetings all,

I am pleased to announce Veterans Day on the Hill 2023 (VDOTH 23) will take place March 30th. Like in years past the DAV will be hosting a free lunch for attendees. This will be an opportunity to send a clear message once again to our lawmakers that we expect to see results for our Veterans, their families and survivors.

Right out let me answer a question I am asked frequently: "Does Veterans Day on the Hill matter?"

YES. Showing up, making some noise, letting your lawmakers know you are paying attention, and holding them accountable does matter. We don't get a Veterans Omnibus last year without a noisy, passionate, and educated group showing up for VDOTH. We just don't. Imagine what we could do if more of you showed up..

This year we will focus on several areas:

Veterans Omnibus- The only proper way to consider Veterans legislation is on its own merits, we should never again be lumped in with partisan issues.

Property Tax Value Exclusion- We need to eliminate the 2 years after death limit on when a surviving spouse can apply, it is leaving out surviving spouses of Vietnam, Gulf War, and Post 9/11 Veterans through not fault of their own.

Property Tax Value Exclusion- We need to increase the amount of value excluded for our disabled Veterans. Home values and property taxes have skyrocketed in Minnesota. Leaving Veterans, many on fixed incomes, facing rising property tax bills and seeing this valuable benefit eroded. It also must be fixed to inflation.

Replace Hastings Veterans Home- Buildings on that campus are crumbing. The facilities are outdated and can't properly serve all Veterans. There is federal money 2 for 1 if we bond the replacement. Our Minnesota Veterans deserve better.

There is more, and you will hear more from me in the lead up and as session kicks off in January.



CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

We hope all of you had the opportunity to enjoy family and friends, while resting over the Christmas and New Year time frame. We will be continuing our discussion from last month about the two sides of giving. On the one side we want it to be meaningful, dedicated to God, a blessing to help others in need. All of this is done while building relationships so others can trust Jesus Christ's sacrifice, as Son of God, on the cross to save us from our very own personal sins. On the other side of giving are those who interfere with a person's trust in Christ or takes advantage of others using an oppressive financial system for nothing but their own (personal or ministry) interests.

A case in point was during Jesus' time when the Jews brought their animal sacrifices to the temple to celebrate the Passover (Exodus 12, Deuteronomy 16:1-16). A person needed an approved animal for worship. This instruction was given by God and communicated to the Jews through Moses. This sacrifice was very important because it was the cost of Israel's sin - the death of an innocent animal. The very first sacrifice for sin was done by God to clothe Adam and Eve (Genesis 3:21). Down through the ages, since Adam and Eve, God uses the blood of animals to temporarily cover a person's sin. This sacrificial system designed by God for the benefit of His people, ends up into a developing industry for the buying and selling of animals with currency exchanges being done *in the temple*. As a result, Jesus threw out the money changer's animals, while overturning their tables as a means of cleaning out the "marketplace / den of thieves" and restoring the temple to its' original use for prayer (Luke 19:45-47, John 2:13-22; cross reference to Psalm 69:9, New Living Translation). The Bible has much to say about these two sides of giving and unfortunately even for today, these lines are often crossed or blurred, just as the money changers had dome when they moved into the temple.

Although this event actually took place under the old covenant, prior to Jesus establishing the new covenant, the basic bridging principle continues today. Jesus' statement, "Get these things out of here, stop turning my Father's house into a marketplace" (John 2:16, New Living Translation) is as true today as it was back then. This is true with some ministries, who start out on the right track, but over time their financial structure and *focus* shifts from prayer and trusting Christ for the removal of their sins (Hebrews 10) to making more money. Yes, there has been ministries who have done so, and talk more about money and their personal experiences then focusing on the scriptures. God saving your spirit now and after death through Jesus' sacrifice of death on the cross for sin (John 3:16-17) is more important than money. As a result, with Jesus' sacrifice, animal sacrifices were no longer needed. So, when you give money to a ministry, please do so out of the freedom God provides (II Corinthians 9:7). Any ministry who pushes/emphasizes making money, or claims of healing that are obviously false, or displaying signs and wonders is a scam (Matthew 7:21-23 & Matthew 24:24).

As biblical citizens, not only paying taxes and giving to ministries can be legitimate and good, (Romans 13:6-7), but there is a dark side to avoid as well. So please let's all give to the government what we owe. Give to God freely from your heart through ministries or helping someone who is in need. Thank goodness for all veterans we have the Veteran Service Organizations to help veterans while increasing the quality here on earth. If there is a need or would like to talk, please give us a call. 
