CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Greetings all, as mentioned last month, we are continuing our discussion about Jesus Christ's future return to earth with its' meaning and application for today. We will be looking at Matthew 24, I Thessalonians 4:13-18, Revelation 19 and others. Just as the pre-flood population of the world knew there was going to be a future judgment (flood); we too, know of a future judgment (fire). Just as we wrote about hope for the pre-flood population, we want to write about our hope for this, and future generations.

Jesus reassures His disciples with hope in their immediate, confusing, and hopeless situation - His death and departure. Jesus is letting them know He is preparing a place for them in heaven (John 14). Jesus gives us and all future generations this same hope. The assurance of His absolute return back to earth, referring to Daniel 7:

- "...when all these things begin to happen, stand up and lift your head..." (Luke 21:28, New International Version)
- "...immediately after the tribulation of those days ... And he will send out his angels with a loud trumpet call, and they will gather His elect from the four winds..." (Matt 24:29-31, Berean Standard Bible)
- "...at that time, after the anguish of those days... And he will send out his angels to gather his chosen ones from all over the world..." (Mark 13:24-27, New Living Translation)

The elect and chosen mentioned above are all believers that make up the church -The Bride of Christ (Ephesians 5:22-33) and all Israel (Romans 11:26-29). Just as all past generations of believers have experience wars, rumors of wars, distress, and plaques here on earth we can find hope in Jesus words. "I have told you these things, so that in Me you may have [perfect] peace. In the world you will have tribulation and distress and suffering, but be courageous [be confident, be undaunted, be filled with joy]; I have overcome the world." [My conquest is accomplished, My victory abiding.]" (John 16:33, Amplified Bible). This was the same hope Noah and his family had in God, while they prepared to go through the flood.

Jesus did not come here to condemn us, but rather to save us from God's wrath, judgment, and punishment for not acknowledging who Christ is and His mission; Christ's death on the cross as payment for our sins (John 3:15-17, Romans 3:23-25). Jesus even offered this same saving commitment of Himself to the very people who demanded his crucifixion (Acts 2:37-41).

The pre-flood population and our pre-fire generation both share the same hope in the middle of two very different distressing realities (II Peter 3). Just as Noah and his family went through the flood, so we will be going through a variety of distressing situations in our lives too, but as believers we will always have the hope and expectation of being caught up in the atmosphere to meet Christ and be with Him forever (1 Thessalonians 4:16-17). Just as there are believers who are under God's throne, who have been told to wait until the end of the final days, so we too, must also wait (Revelation 6:9-11). This brings up the issue of speculation while we are waiting.

There has been a lot of prophetic speculation in the past, about future events that never came true. I recall during Desert Shield some preachers were suggesting that war was leading up to the final war of Armageddon and Christ's return with all believers (Revelation 16:16 and chapter 19) - not so fast. Speculation helps nobody, only time will tell. Yet we do know our hope is in Christ, and the scriptures are true.
