Greetings to all our DAV Comrades and our wonderfully exceptional DAV Auxiliary, we hope the very best for your family time during Thanksgiving and Christmas.

We close with our last article, of the last month, for this year. This article is being written a few days before Thanksgiving, and just as we have experienced for the last 20 + years, we all find ourselves in a very sobering time. Unfortunately, Thanksgiving for many of our comrades in arms is not necessarily a pleasant time, we are continually reminded of world events, as well as family and social disruptions, therefore our meaningful and sobering prayers are with everyone who needs hope from God and kindness from others.

We are all keenly aware of the events in the Middle East as well as the ramifications, actions of others, as well as the backlash throughout the world. The United States is certainly not immune. Today, there are many groups of people with various perceptions, opinions and attitudes transcending back into the history of the 19th and 20th Centuries regarding the events leading up to the establishment and continued existence of The State of Israel as a homeland for the Jewish people, ever since God's call to Abraham.
