CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Greetings to all you fun loving people,

Another year has come and gone, and we are all moving into another year. Many of us are contemplating any number of events that may continue to unfold and reveal interesting developments throughout the world. Just imagine for a moment the many ways that events, technology, and society, have changed the course and direction of our lives. Yet, the scriptures remain the same as God continues to move forward in his plan of redemption for all those who seek Him and the direction, He has for each of our lives (Daniel 7).

We are continuing to reflect upon the honor of the Jewish people to include the wonderful existence of Israel as a nation as reflected in the scriptures, particularly the Books of Ezekiel, Isaiah, and Romans. We continue with considering the tumultuous history of the Jewish people and the modern-day establishment of The State of Israel, one may ask; what benefit, or favor is there for being a Jew, or in other words, why do the Jewish people continue to persevere? This is a very intriguing question, yet it was a question Paul - Apostle to the Gentiles, asked his readers at Rome, around 57AD, when he wrote from Corinth (Romans 3). Paul answered this question by writing the scripture (Romans 3:2), "Much in every way. To begin with to the Jews were entrusted the oracles (the brief communications, the intensions, the utterances) of God" (cross reference to Psalm 147:19) - Amplified Bible. Paul was writing about the salvation history of the Jewish People from the time of Abraham to a time when that salvation history was beginning to incorporate Gentiles.

This time frame is what Jesus was describing when He stated, "... and Jerusalem will be trodden down by the Gentiles until the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled (completed)" (Luke 21:24; cross reference to Isaiah 63:18 and Daniel 8:13) - Amplified Bible. Jesus stated the event that would usher in this phase of salvation history is the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple, which occurred in 70 AD, thirteen years after Paul wrote his letter to the Romans. Paul further mentioned that the length of this time frame in Jewish history would be however long it takes to bring or usher in, the salvation of the Gentiles.

Please allow a moment of observation at this point. Notice the "time of the Gentiles" would begin with the destruction of Israel and the Temple, so does that mean on the other side of the time continuum that the event of the establishment of the modern state of Israel starts to conclude or finish the "time of the Gentiles"? This is an interesting observation and a good question, but before we continue, it's interesting to note the period of Jewish history we are currently living in, or experiencing now is a mystery written about by Paul (Romans 11). While Paul was writing about this mystery of salvation history (Romans 11:25), he also included the graciousness of God and a very severe warning of immense importance to us Gentiles, in other words, we are to be very careful about our attitude towards the Jewish People (Romans 11:20-29). As a result, there is absolutely no room for an attitude of anti-Semitism in the heart of a Christian as we have seen all over the place through the media. As Christians we are in-fact, according to God's view, Jewish people (Romans 2:29).

We see here that the Jewish people were chosen by God and entrusted with the most sacred of duties, to preserve His land and oracles. Despite all of their hardships, they remain steadfast. I hope this encourages all people from all walks of life to follow the example of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Elijah and to know Jesus Christ.
