



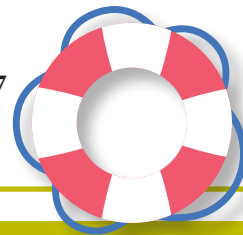

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Hello (English), Boozhoo (Chippewa), Annyeonghaseyo (Korean), Shalom (Hebrew), Konnichiwa (Japanese), Mrhban (Arabic) all you fine, outstanding and honorable veterans and family members. This month we begin from our last article (June 2026) and directly move into Ephesians 3:10 -11 ***'God's purpose in all this was to use the church to display his wisdom in its rich variety to all the unseen rulers and authorities in heavenly places. This was his eternal plan [from creation Genesis 1-3], which he carried out through Christ Jesus our Lord'*** (New Living Translation).

Last month we were looking at God's mysterious plan, now we are looking at God's multifaceted and infinite wisdom. We are shifting our perspective from our view of the church as a building, organization, and gathering of believers (fallible humans - Romans 7:14-25) on earth, to a cosmic lesson in wisdom for all the holy and fallen angels (1 Peter 1:12, Genesis 6:1-7, Jude 6, Ephesians 6:12, Psalm 82:1, Isaiah 6, Job 1:6-12). This multifaceted and infinite wisdom refers to the complexity and beauty of his plan for the church serves as a living and breathing demonstration of God's reconciling power. As a result, God is using the existence and transformation of the church (believers) to demonstrate that his wisdom is superior to any other power in the universe. This silences the claims of those whom spiritually rebelled from the beginning of creation (Satan and demons). All of this has profound significance, especially in two separate areas: 1) Redefining Value: 2) Validation of Suffering. Let's take a look at each one of these.

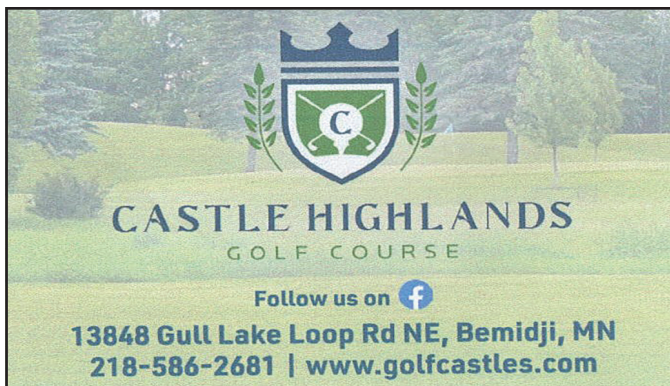
Redefining Value:

We all determine our own worth, value, identity or significance in terms of the standards set forth by culture, society and the era or times we live in. This value is very personal, and relates to productivity, status, and influence, while being subject to when, where, and under what conditions we live. Two examples come to mind - 1940s (World War II reflected upon increased industrialization, war production and the need to win the war); 1960s (societal upheaval, advances in aeronautical sciences / engineering, along with the complexities of U.S. government policy, Vietnam War and the need to honor those who served). Ephesians 3:10 -11 may very well redefine our value in terms of a more important mission: we are part of an eternal, cosmic display of God's grace. Even in our brokenness, when we live in unity and reconciliation with God and others, we are testifying to a reality that transcends our limitations based on our relationship with Jesus Christ. In other words by being God centered instead of self centered, we become more flexible towards the Holy Spirit and obedient towards God's will, no matter what occurs in our life (Romans 8:28). Consequently we will experience spiritual / emotional growth, inner strength, endurance, patience, gentleness (Galatians 5); all the while being shaped to reflect Christ's character. This includes help from the Department of Veteran Affairs.

Validation While Suffering:

Our lives can often be characterized by struggle, confusion and what seems like a never ending question of 'what is life really all about'? Ephesians 3:10 -11 reminds us that even when our situation seems dark or stagnant, we are part of God's larger sovereign purpose. The spiritual warfare we feel is real, but the church's persistence is proof to the powers of darkness that they have already lost (Ephesians 6:10-18).

We want to continue to pray for all our comrades in distress and their family members. We remember caregivers who have a tremendous responsibility managing care for those who depend upon them. Take Care. Mike - DAV, Linda - Auxiliary

Once again, we find ourselves in the regrettable position of having to defend the benefits that disabled veterans earn through their service and sacrifice. This week, a new congressional proposal was unveiled that could cut benefits for up to 1.5 million veterans and reduce future disability compensation payments to them by as much as \$57 billion in just the next 10 years, according to a VA analysis. This is wrong and it must be stopped.

The proposal would effectively stop compensating veterans for the impact of service-connected tinnitus and dramatically reduce compensation for most disabled veterans suffering from sleep apnea if they use a medical device (CPAP) while sleeping. These changes would apply to all new claims as well as any reassessments or reevaluations of existing claims. Eliminating compensation for sleep apnea and tinnitus is not a reflection of improved outcomes for veterans—it is a budget-driven decision that shifts the burden onto those who have already sacrificed in service to our nation.

This 'poison pill' was included in a larger veterans package that includes a number of key DAV priorities, including the Major Richard Star Act, increases for survivors benefits and catastrophically disabled veterans special monthly compensation (SMC) payments, expanded support for family caregivers, improvements in prosthetic equipment, and a number of other provisions DAV has been fighting to enact. However, because of self-imposed rules adopted by the House and Senate known as 'PAYGO', this legislation includes enormous cuts in benefits to supposedly 'pay for' providing veterans with benefits they have already earned.

While we appreciate all good faith efforts to develop and enact a package of positive veterans legislation, we reject the premise that the only way to fulfill the promises made to the men and women who served in the past is by cutting benefits for veterans in the future. Congress has regularly and repeatedly chosen to ignore or waive PAYGO rules and statutes for legislation when it was their priority. We now call on them to place the same priority on benefits and services owed to the men and women who have served, are serving, and will serve to defend our freedom in the future.

A grateful nation should never try to balance its budget on the backs of the men and women who sacrificed so much for our freedom. It's time for Congress to end the use of PAYGO for veterans benefits.

As the voice of the millions of veterans DAV represents, we will not stand by while budgetary considerations are placed above the well-being of all those who served.

DAV will not compromise our core mission of ensuring veterans receive the benefits they have earned and deserve. Nor will we compromise our principles and leave future generations of servicemembers with fewer protections and benefits than those available today.

We remain committed to working with all Members of Congress in a bipartisan spirit, together with our fellow veteran and VSO colleagues, to find a path forward that keeps the nation's promise to all veterans.
