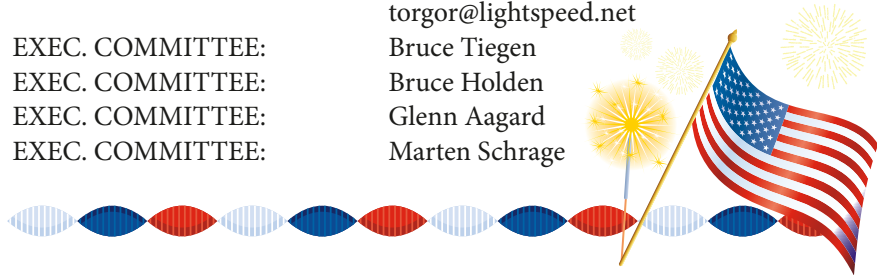

New Business:

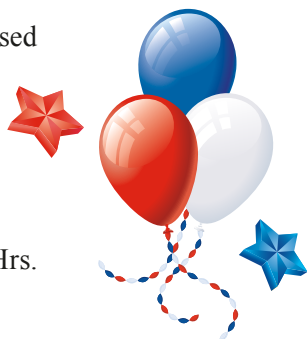
1. Wheelchair ramp was built for a Veteran in need.

South Dakota's DAV has sponsored a service dog, if you are interested go to www.bigpawscanine.com.

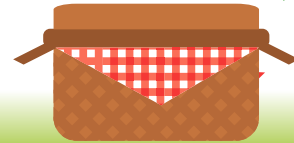

NEW VA AGENT ORANGE RULING REGARDING THE AIR FORCE!

Under this new ruling, Air Force and Air Force Reserve personnel who served on the contaminated **“Operation Ranch Hand” C123’s from 1969 to 1986**, are presumed to have been exposed to herbicides during their service, thus making it easier for them to establish entitlement for some VA benefits if they have developed an “Agent Orange” related presumptive condition, and that their surviving dependents would be eligible for Dependency and Indemnity compensation (DIC) and burial benefits. The interim final rule can be found on the Federal Register website at:

www.federalregister.gov/public-inspection (under the **Sections** tab, click on the **Health & Public Welfare**, mouse over the picture, then click when the writing turns blue)

For more information on applying for these benefits, including the affected units, Air Force Specialty Codes and dates of service for affected crew members, and a listing of Agent Orange-related conditions, visit:

The VA will immediately begin processing claims and issuing benefits to eligible Air Force members. This ruling primarily affects the active duty and reservist personnel who were assigned to flight crew, ground crew or medical crew duties at, but is not limited to, the following stations:

Lockbourne/Rickenbacker Air Force Base, Ohio;

- 906th and 907th Tactical Air Groups
- 355th and 356th Tactical Airlift Squadrons.

Westover Air Force Base, Massachusetts;

- 731st Tactical Air Squadron
- 74th Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron

Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, International Airport;

- 758th Airlift Squadron.



The VA encourages ALL personnel that came in contact with these aircraft during this time period and developed an “Agent Orange” related disability to file a disability compensation claim. GUN SALUTES VS THREE RIFLE VOLLEYS

At military funerals, one often sees three volleys of shots fired in honor of the deceased veteran. This is often mistaken as a 21-gun salute, although it is entirely different. In the military, a “gun” is a large-calibered weapon like a Cannon or Howitzer. The three volleys are fired from “rifles,” not “guns” and therefore, the three volley rifle firing isn’t a “gun” salute. The three volleys comes from an old battlefield custom. The two warring sides would cease hostilities to clear their dead from the battlefield, and the firing of three volleys meant that the dead had been properly cared for and the side was ready to resume the battle. Anyone who is entitled to a military funeral is entitled to the three rifle volleys, subject to availability of honor guard teams. There are simply three rifle volleys fired. The firing team can consist of any number, but one usually sees a team of eight, with a noncommissioned officer in charge of the firing detail. Whether the team consists of three or eight, or ten, each member fires three times (three volleys). The honor guard detail often presents three shell-casings to the family. Each casing representing one volley.

In the USA, a modern day “Gun” salute can vary depending on who is being honored or for which ceremony the salute is given. They are 21, 19, 17, 15, 13, 11, 7, and 5 with the tradition on Independence Day to be 50 rounds, one round for each state in the union.

A U.S. presidential death also involves a 21 gun salute and other military traditions. On the day after the death of the president, a former president or president-elect, unless this day falls on a Sunday or holiday, in which case the honor will be rendered the following day, the commanders of Army installations with the necessary personnel and material traditionally order that one gun be fired every half-hour, beginning at reveille and ending at retreat. On the day of burial, a 21 “minute gun” salute traditionally is fired starting at noon at all military installations with the necessary personnel and material. Guns will be fired at one-minute intervals. Also on the day of burial, those installations will fire a 50-gun salute—one round for each state—at five-second intervals immediately following lowering of the flag.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

THE COMMING CRISIS

Webster's: Crisis, A turning point for better or worse - A condition or period of instability, difficulty, etc.

The other evening I was watching CNN News and a commentator came on and the discussion was Christianity accompanied by charts and graphs. The point being made was that in just a short few years Christianity will be a minor religious force in the world. Wow, I thought, what is going on? We can see how this is taking place in Europe already with church attendance down and churches being closed and Mosques popping up all over the place. This is a frightening proposition when I think of what kind of world this will be for my children / Grandchildren and it ought to be a concern to all Christians the world over, especially here in the United States.
