CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Last month we were looking at the strategies of Satan within the realm and reality of spiritual warfare. The purpose of Satan's strategy is to steal, kill and destroy our lives and relationship with Christ (Job 1; 2:1-7, John 10:10). At the same time God gives us the grace to persevere, while working things out for our good (Romans 8:28) even though it does not seem that way. These hard things really can distract us from our relationship with Christ, causing doubt and uncertainty. This month we will look at the day-to-day ramifications of living out our lives here on earth in obedience to Christ.

Repentance is an important key, yet forgiveness of others-self and humility towards God are too, again this is not something easy to do, especially with the pain, anxiety, PTSD, unjust bureaucracy-laws, civiliansemployers (some veterans too) who are clueless, broken relationships, or other disabling conditions many of us deal with daily. We always want to correct the injustice in our lives because of our own sense of justice and it does go against our natural grain to allow God to take action on our behalf (I Corinthians 2:14). When we allow God the space and time to correct injustices this does not mean we gave up or it will never be done. Just because we are letting them off our hook (forgiveness). does not mean they are off God's hook. God is more interested in our character, salvation and our relationship with Him (not religion-Isaiah 1), then anything else. He wants us to be free. Forgiveness, although hard, allows us to live in god's freedom and outside of people's oppression. In some cases it means to change our understanding and attitude, petition the courts-other avenues of recourse (Luke 18:1-8), pray and be kind (Matthew 5:44), debate the issue (Proverbs 25:9), seek guidance and or treatment from others (Galatians 6:2, Luke 5:31), do the right thing regardless of the consequences, or not do anything at all but wait on God to work out the issues (Proverbs 20:22). In any of these situations we want to know the correct meaning of the scriptures, the heart of God and follow the Holy Spirit's leading with patience (James 5:7-18). If nothing else, revenge and retaliation are definitely not up to us, rather it is God who is the person to set things right (Romans 12:19, Luke 18:1-8). What else does this look like?

As a believer in Christ, God and people hold us to a higher standard. Yet, some believers and others who claim to be believers have been a poor example for Christ. This in turn gives other people living for God a bad name. This does not involve situations when we do the right thing and people take us the wrong way, misrepresent and lie about us. Rather it means not to have improper or criminal sexual conduct, steal, murder, gossip, speak ill of others, commit extortion and fraud etc. We are living under a microscope. When things like this become known, people with a skeptical view that do not know Christ will think there is no distinction between believers and non-believers. We do not want to give Christ a bad name. It is not in word and deed, but in attitude too. This really does reflect the condition of the heart towards God. This is why Paul cautions believers to live in the freedom Christ provides (Romans 6, I Corinthians 5 [cross reference II Corinthians 2 & 7] Galatians 5). Our prayer for you is found in Romans 16:20 (cross reference: Genesis 3:14-15), which is God's plan for His people on Earth.


