

He was proud beyond words of how Chapter 7 pulled together to establish a solid, growing organization in your efforts to help fellow veterans. He was proud to serve as your Commander for the last five years.

I wish you the best in your leadership transitions and wish you the best for the future of your organization. I will be volunteering in some capacity and just need a little time to grieve the loss of my gentle, joyful comrade in marriage.

> David Lee Sterr was born September 9, 1939 in Fond du Lac, WI to Leland and Lauretta (Braun) Sterr. He grew up on the family farm in Lomira, WI, graduating from Campbellsport High School in 1958. At the age of 19 he entered Army basic training at Fort Leonard Wood, MO and continued on to advanced training at Fort Gordon GA. Dave was stationed at the NATO base in Kolsas, Norway from 1959 to 1963 and was honorably discharged in 1965 as a Sergeant E-5. Dave married Sandra Hoffman on January 6, 1968 at St. Matthews Methodist Church in Fond du Lac, WI. He reenlisted in 1971 stationed at Fort Campbell, KY. Due to an injury, he was hospitalized and medically discharged from Walter Reed Army Hospital in 1972.

> Following his military service, Dave attended the University of Florida at Gainesville, FL and graduated in 1975 with a degree in Forestry. He retired in 2005 following 30 years with the US Government Bureau of Indian Affairs in



Bemidji MN, as the Agency Forester with forest management responsibilities for 7 reservations in MN: Leech Lake, Net Lake, White Earth, Mille Lacs, Fond du Lac, Grand Portage, and Red Lake.

Dave lived a very active life. From his forestry days walking through the woods marking trees, golfing, biking, cross country skiing, snowshoeing, even down to walking his granddog, Daisy. Dave had a special interest in American History and Civil War History, researching and reading more books than we can count. He also remained actively involved in his men's groups, the Romeos and Retired Foresters.

Dave always had a passion for helping others. His time spent in Walter Reed and the tireless physical therapy he received to recover from his injury sparked his drive for helping other disabled veterans, and he devoted his retirement years to supporting the Disabled American Veterans Organization. In March of 2014 he became Commander of Chapter 7 of the Disabled American Veterans. He was proud to serve with the members and volunteers of the organization and they became dear friends to him.

He is survived by his wife Sandra Sterr of Bemidji, daughters Gail Sterr and Kelly (Lyan) Karger of Bemidji, granddaughter Ridley Karger, grandson Bryce Karger, brother Eugene (Sharon) Sterr of West Bend, WI, sister Karen Sterr of Asheville, NC, sister Mary Lynn (Gary) Crist of Hendersonville, NC, and sister Joan (Steven) Haber of Arden, NC. He is also survived by many other loving relatives. He was preceded in death by his parents.

# **CHAPLAIN'S CORNER**

Last month we were discussing Justice, Mercy and Grace. Understanding the meaning behind each of these words can have a profound impact on our lives and hearts. This is especially true when we as veterans are surrounded by so many instances of people being disingenuous. Last month's article reflected upon on justice and the way some very disingenuous Pharisees/Scribes were setting up a woman for a fall, all for the purpose of entrapping Jesus (John 7:53-8:11).

Christ's response consists of wisdom, discernment, mercy and grace. This has nothing to do with enabling, dismissing, or in any other way disregarding the justice the woman deserved. Jesus managed all points of the issue, to include the ulterior motives and disingenuous attitudes of the accusers as well.

Many people think sex was at the heart of this issue, just look at the title of this section in the King James Version, "Jesus Forgives an Adulterous" or the New Revised Standard, "The Woman Caught in Adultery". The titles of this section in the different translations does not help. Sex had absolutely nothing to do with this incident, it could very well have been any other violation in Moses' Law. This is because the whole purpose of the incident was to accuse Jesus, set Him up for a fall and entrap Him (John 8:9). In short, the Pharisees/ Scribes wanted to get Christ, their very own Messiah, The Son of God, into trouble with the authorities (Roman and Jewish) in order to get rid of Him and it did not matter how this was done. Just as the Pharisees/Scribes used Moses' Law in an unethical manner to force Justice, Jesus used Moses' Law in an ethical manner to show Mercy while addressing the Justice issue at the same time.

The law used was Deuteronomy 22:22 and Leviticus 20:10. Notice the manner in which the Pharisees/Scribes specifically overlooked one minor issue - the man was required to be stoned to death too. Oops, and of course there was one other minor issue the Pharisees/Scribes did not have the authority under Roman Law to sentence a person to death (John 18:31). Jesus through His wisdom had to address these two law issues as well as separate the Pharisees/Scribes from the woman. Yet, at the same time, Jesus shows mercy to the woman, and applies that same level of mercy to her accusers (Pharisees/Scribes) with just one statement, 'He that is without sin among you, let him first cast the first stone.' (John 8:7). As a side note, keep in mind, this is not just throwing a rock or two, in order to punish, but rather for every person to throw a rock for the purpose of killing her. As a result of saying this statement, Jesus gave them time to think about what he said. Look at the wonderful effect this had on each of the Pharisees/Scribes (John 8:8-9). Jesus allows the conviction the Pharisees/Scribes feel as a means for them to examine themselves for wrong motives and to let the woman go. This is mercy, which is define as not getting what a person deserves. This is the mercy Jesus shows the woman in their conversation (John 8:10-11a). Jesus says: 'Woman, where are your accusers, hasn't any of them condemned you?', Her reply is: 'No man Lord.' What a wonderful sense of relief for her. Jesus continues the conversation by giving her grace, which is an encouragement not to sin again. Notice that Jesus encouragement is not beating the issue over her head but encouraging the fact she can live free. Grace is always taking the next step by encouraging someone and something we will pick up in next month's article.

On October 9, 2018, President Trump signed Public Law 115-258, which provides a cost-ofliving adjustment (COLA) increase of 2.8 percent, effective December 1, 2018, for Veteran's Disability Compensation and Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC) for survivors and certain other benefits. VA compensation and DIC benefits are retrospectively paid on the first of each month, for the previous month. This means that the 2.8 COLA increase effective December 1, 2018, will not be included until the January 1, 2019 payment. This increase matches the COLA provided to Social Security recipients.
