- C. Introduction of Guests or Visitors: Peter Buesseler, Wally and Cathy Peck were introduced. They are three of the leaders of the Birds, Bees, and Butterflies organization. The organization's mission is to support the community-wide efforts of planting native species of plants throughout the area which creates a better habitat for birds, pollinators and people. They shared with the membership their plans to create a peace garden across the road from the new Veterans' Home.
