CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Welcome to our Disabled American Veterans Chapter and Unit 7 Newsletter. As a method of communication, we are always encouraged to keep in touch with you about the many activities and events taking place in our organization. As a means of support with our relationships to our County Veterans Service Officers(CVSO's), other veteran service organizations (VFW, American Legion, etc), other community organizations (Food Shelf, Northwood's Care Givers, etc), VA Clinic and Home, along with our many sponsors, we genuinely want to encourage everyone to have a blessed day. We all notice that each and every one of the above-mentioned organizations has a unique role to play. This critical role is not only vital to the organization itself and its members, but crucial to the community as a whole.

Okay, so the question becomes, where in the world is this article going? We are so glad to have you read this question. The answer is ... (drum roll please) ... this article is going out to be edited, printed, and mailed to all of you fine outstanding and service orientated people. Oops, do you mean that the answer just now given is not what you meant? The jig is up, this much is true, this article is about roles.

Men and women have separate roles, not only do they have different roles in the family, community, and society as a whole, but biblically too. There have been countless books, college courses and even specific organizations describing the many issues surrounding separate and different roles, this includes The Department of Defense. These two verses should never be used to justify unkind words or ill treatment towards anyone, our unit members, or our sisters in arms. Those who commit such acts of cruelty are not representing the Holy Spirit's guidance, nor the kindness and tolerance of GOD our Father.

Now that we understand how not to apply these two scriptures, the question becomes, what would be a good application for these two scriptures? The answer is ... (drum roll please) ... in our mind, heart and actions towards others let us understand the meaning of the biblical roles of men and women, which can be traced back to Genesis 3 (the first 5 bullets below), with the sixth bullet being a biblical truth:

- Women were created in the image of GOD.
- Women are to help men because men really do need the help (smile guys).
- GOD specifically told a man not to sin.
- A man was responsible for protecting woman and telling her not to sin.
- The man willfully sinned (disobey GOD), the woman was tricked that is, she was deceived by Satan, usually by making that person do something that they did not intend to do.
- We are all representatives / ambassadors for Christ wanting to encourage (draw) everyone to follow Christ, since GOD comforts and heals.

It is for the above reasons; we believe Paul writes that a man is responsible for the role of preaching or leadership in the church. Therefore, due to the spiritual nature of this role man has this responsibly that Paul writes about.


