



Welcome to our Disabled American Veterans Chapter and Unit 7 Newsletter. We are always encouraged to keep in touch about activities taking place in our organization. We are looking forward to our picnic, so we all hope to see y'all there (smile)!

As we begin a new month with our newsletter, we were considering the meaning of worship and the question, what does worship look like? Normally we have the perception of worship only being done in church through singing and listening to the sermon, although singing and listening to the sermon are forms of worship, there is much more than this. As a result, we are back to our original question and a practical application for us all, "What does worship look like, and can we do so in a practical manner on any given day? Well, let's take a look at this.

Take for example the scripture - Colossians 3:17: "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (English Standard Version - ESV). Yet there is another letter written by Paul the Apostle, referring to the very same activity - I Corinthians 10:31: "So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God" (New International Version - NIV). Paul further helps to explain the meaning of these words as he describes our bodies as a living sacrifice, in other words - worship: Romans 12:1 ". Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship" (Orthodox Jewish Bible - OJB). Jesus stated worship can only be done in the spirit - John 4:23-24: "But the time is coming—indeed it's here now—when true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and in truth. The Father is looking for those who will worship him that way. <sup>24</sup> For God is Spirit, so those who worship him must worship in spirit and in truth" (New Living Translation).

The way we worship God, according to the above scriptures, depends on our spiritual temperament, which predisposes us to the way we naturally worship God. We would suggest that for some people (of a particular temperament) seem to clash with others of a different temperament because of their personality and lack of understanding these differences. This situation is very unfortunate.

There are several temperaments and while none of us will completely fit into any one particular temperament, we all have a combination of a few overriding or main temperaments God has given us. We are all unique in skills, aptitudes, personalities and this includes our spiritual temperament as well. The temperaments are Naturalist, Sensate, Traditionalist, Activist, Ascetic, Caregiver, Enthusiast, Contemplative, and Intellectual. We can begin to understand our spiritual temperament by asking a few questions in each of the listed temperaments and noticing our reactions through the answers given, for example, while reading one question, a person may intuitively answer with, "Absolutely - Yeah, that is me." Therefore, that particular answer is rated as a 5. Another person may intuitively answer with "No way, that is definitely not me." Therefore, that particular answer is rated a 1. The higher the score, the more prone an individual is to that particular spiritual temperament and therefore displays certain worship characteristics, which is a reflection of who they are - it's very personal. We will be examining each of these spiritual temperaments over the next few months, while keeping this article in mind.

Greetings all,

Yesterday something cool happened in Washington, D.C. (well, cool if you are a legislative guy) that I wanted to share with you.

The DAV National legislative team was testifying at a subcommittee hearing, which is a common occurrence since we have one of, if not, the best legislative teams in D.C. The topic was Beneficiary Travel Pay. Those of you who attended my seminar on resolutions at the Fall Conference two years ago will probably recall that the example we created during the process concerned beneficiary travel and the disastrous system the VA uses. During that seminar, we came up with our complaints (whereas clauses) and our solution (therefore clause).

I took the work we did together and drafted a resolution, which you all considered at the Department Convention that year. The resolution passed and was forwarded to the National Convention in Atlantic City. In Atlantic City, the National Convention Committee met, considered our resolution, and recommended adopting it. The Delegates adopted our resolution, and it became National Resolution #015: Establish Automatic Payment of Travel Pay for Eligible Disabled Veterans Without Additional Barriers

So yesterday in D.C. Minnesota's own Jon Retzer testified on the problems with Beneficiary Travel, the barriers of an online system, and the need to change it. The authority he had to do that comes from our members, and specifically he was able to testify on this issue because of Resolution # 015, thought up by our members, and forwarded to the National Convention by the Dept. of Minnesota.

As lawmakers work to improve the VA's travel pay system, and as the DAV's team advocates for the solutions in Resolution 015, you can take pride in knowing it originate right here in MN, during one of those Fall Conference seminars.

Please keep that in mind as you work to identify problems and solutions for Veterans, their families, and survivors. I have even created a handy little tool to help you build your resolutions that you can find here.
